Bid Awarded For Pipe Line Over Railroad

Mount Joy Borough's sewerage plans are in the hands of the state department in Harrisburg, it was announced by Joseph Michaels. Mr. Michaels made the announcement at the regular meeting of the local borough authority Tuesday nite in the Gerberich-Payne Shoe Company office. According to the members of the authority, it is customary for the departfent to examine plans for approximately one to two months. Until that time, nothing can be done on the local level toward the completion of the plan.

Bids were opened for the laying of a 12-inch water main across the railroad tracks. Choosing the lowest bidder, the Posey Iron Works of Lancaster, was awarded the contract for \$7,407.00. The firm announced that work will be started as soon as formal permission is received from the Pennsylvania Railroad. The 12-inch pipe will be placed within another protection pipe and will cross the railroad at the Lumber Street bridge. The mains had been completed prior to this time on either side of the bridge.
