**LEGISLATIVE
ROUND-UP**

Harrisburg — A fouled-up Legislature meets this week - the Senate the early part and the House the latter part - as budget and tax discussions between administration and anti-administration forces continue.

In the Senate this week interest has centered around the controversial point of providing now-overdue subsidies to the school districts throughout the state as Republicans, hedging

on going along with the House-passed version consider their own subsidy bill.

And in the lower chamber the administration's much talked about highway program bill is up for a hassle-dassle with chances good of this measure passing the House - but like most other legislation, stalling in the Senate.

Of interest and concern is the proposal to change the formula for reimbursement of local communities on liquid fuels tax, one of the primary parts of the new highway program.

For example while liquid tax reimbursements to local communities on the whole would be upped under the new highway plan, the greatest percentage of the increased reimbursements would go to larger cities which receive as much as 65 percent greater return, while second-class townships would receive

only a rough 20 percent increase. The funds are used for local road work, which underscores the importance attached to the pending legislation.

Elsewhere on the legislative front few new bills are appearing these days as lawmakers reach what is just about the saturation point.

Primary point of interest centers around the current budget and tax compromise talks now under way between legislative leaders and the Governor.

When and if these will be resolved is a point each day becoming of more and more concern with rank and file lawmakers.

Indications are that little will be accomplished in any sort of final manner until after the November elections. Administration forces remain fairly adamant on opposing any appreciable cuts in the near two

billion dollar budget now before the Legislature, while anti-administration forces are equally persistent that some cuts be made.

On another tax front, the proposed constitutional amendment that would permit Pennsylvania to enact a graduated income tax is exciting little or no concern among legislative leaders who point out that in addition to having to pass the current session it would also have to pass the 1957 session - and then finally be approved by the voters of the state, a move generally viewed now as quite unlikely.

Just how long the current Legislature continues its hop-and-skip sessioning forced upon it by a hotel room shortage among other things, remains to be determined by budget and tax developments this and next week.
