Statement Printed to Comply With Recently Enacted Law Of Congress

Harrisburg -PNS- Colorful fall foliage unquestionably is beautiful - but it can become quite a hazard when its beauty distracts the attention of Keystone State motorists, Pennsylvania State Police cautioned this week.

"Thousands of sightseers are adding to the traffic through the mountains of Pennsylvania at present and will continue to do so as fall progresses," commented State Police Commissioner E. J. Henry.

"Many motorists will be attracted by the beauties of Pennsylvania's forests. This same splendor can cause serious mishaps if drivers divide their attention between the scenery and driving," he said.

The Commissioner suggested that drivers who wish to view the many-hued and fast denuding hills, should pull off the road at a safe distance and not proceed until they are ready to pay full attention to their driving.

He understands the point that driving is a full time task, adding that many accidents result from inattention on the part of the driver.

Not only is strict attention to driving necessary to adequately maneuver a motor vehicle, but also to observe the signs and signals that regulate and protect the flow of traffic.
