## PLYMOUTH NINE MONTHS. SALES EXCEED HALF MILLION CARS

Plymouth dealers sold more than a half million new Plymouth cars during the first nine months of 1955 and are well on their way to the biggest year in their history.

S. W. Hodgson, regional sales manager, made this announcement in connection with a dealer preview at Allentown of Plymouth's new aerodynamic 1956 cars. The new models will be publicly introduced Oct. 21.

Hodgson said retail deliveries passed the half million mark in mid-September. Sales are up more than 75 percent over 1954 and are the greatest for any comparable period in Plymouth's history. Production of '56 models began late in September.

"Plymouth is gaining on the other two cars in the low price field," Hodgson said. "Our share of the market rose from 7.3 percent in 1954 to 9.7 percent in 1955. Our goal for 1956 is 11.6 percent of the market."

## Rural Safety Award Given In State

Pennsylvania rural areas hung up on excellent fire safety record for the first nine months of 1955 with no deaths reported from this prolific killer during the period. This was announced by Carson F. Mertz, farm safety chief, as the state and nation observed Fire Prevention Week, Oct. 9 - 15.

Mertz praised rural residents for the outstanding record. In 1954 there were eight deaths caused by fire: four from misuse of kerosene; one due to gasoline; one attributed to an overheated stove; and two in field fires.

The fire demon claimed 54 lives in rural Pennsylvania during 1951, 1952 and 1953: 39 from kerosene; 4 in barn fires; 4 in field conflagrations; two caused by cigarettes and cleaning fluid; and four in fires causes of which are unknown.

Mertz cautioned rural folks against such fire hazards as defective chimneys, spark on combustible roofs, improper use of kerosene and gasoline, inadequate lightning protection, unsafe stove and furnace installations, carelessness with matches and misuse of electricity and appliances.
