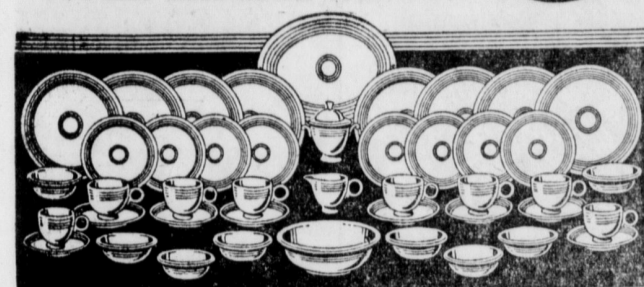

Penna. Game Commission Weekly Letter

Qualified information on the present status of big game species in Pennsylvania was collected to guide the Game Commission in establishing the '55 season as follows, for the reasons given:

Bears - Observation by Commission personnel and the number of damage complaints indicate that the number of bears still appears to be high in spite of the increased kill in 1954. Consequently, the Commission decided that a season of two weeks would do no harm to the species and at the same time materially assist in controlling damage complaints.

Deer (Antlered) - The Commission acted to allow a season of the usual length on antlered deer based upon the fact that there appears to be sufficient numbers to justify the season as set. The Commission's experience in legalizing the taking of spike bucks with antlers three or more inches long without points, during the antlered season, has proved satisfactory and was therefore continued by the Commission for 1955 season.

Deer (Antlerless) - In many areas of the State deer are damaging farm crops and causing loss to farmers - are over-browsing forest growth, which is detrimental to forest resources and to the deer as well - and are responsible for many highway accidents resulting in loss of life and large amounts of property damage. At a meeting held in Harrisburg on June 30, 1955, when all the recognized conservation agencies met with the Commission, it was the unanimous opinion that the Commission should recognize the fact that there are too many deer in many parts of the State and that action should be taken to correct the situation. The Commission has utilized all information available in establishing the kill quotas in com-

ties where these problems are present and has purposely established high quotas of licenses in some counties and low quotas in others. It is believed that an antlerless deer season of two days will not endanger the deer herd in any way and that unless the surplus is harvested the deer range will be further damaged in many places.

Deer (Bow and Arrow) - Consistent with the provisions of the law the Commission acted to establish a bow and arrow season for male deer with two or more points to an antler and further provided a male deer with antlers three or more inches long without points, measuring from the top of the skull as the deer is in life, shall be considered legal. The length of the season was established from Oct. 10 to 22, comparable to that of 1954. The Commission believed this would have no adverse effect upon the deer herd, which judgment is based upon the experience during the past three archery seasons.

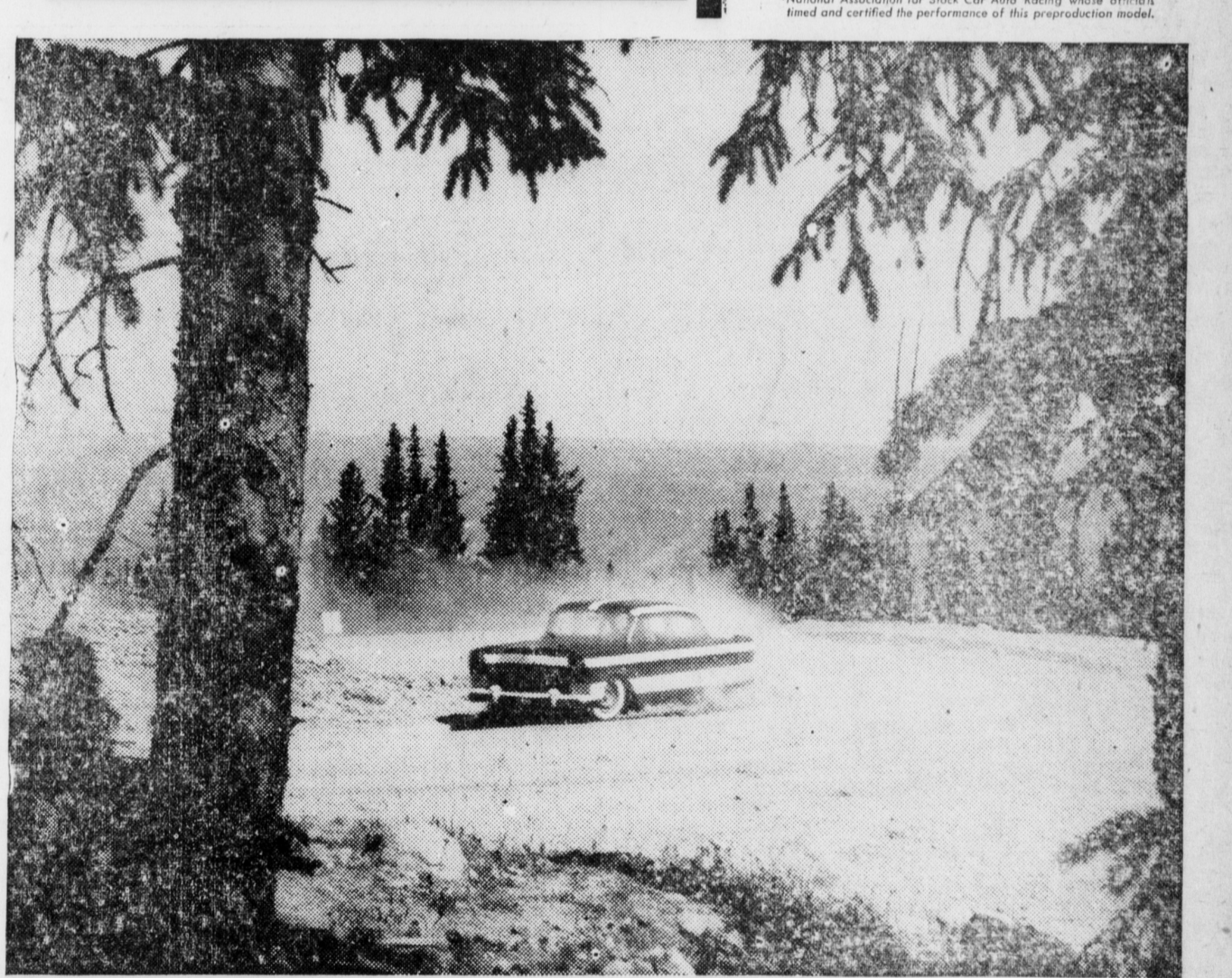
