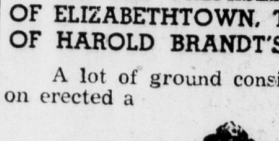

les W. Brooks, Mount Joy; and

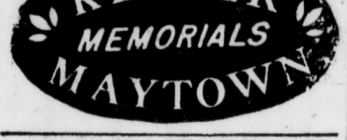
