Dr. Eisenhower To Judge State Town Contest

Dr. Eisenhower, President of the Pennsylvania State University, has accepted the chairmanship of a five-member board of judges to select the winners of Pennsylvania's \$10,000 Community Development Contest, in which 214 towns and cities are competing. Announcement of Dr. Eisenhower's acceptance was made today by the Penna. State Chamber of Commerce, one of six organizations sponsoring the contest as a means of encouraging and rewarding economic and civic progress. The other sponsors are: Bell Telephone Company, Pennsylvania Electric Association, Pennsylvania Farm Bureau Federation, Penna. Gas Association, and the Penna. Motor Truck Association.

ial Director of "Town Journal." The judges will select twelve communities for awards on the basis of progress made throughout 1955 on specific projects designated in the official entry blanks.

The following prizes will be awarded in each of three population groups: First, \$1,500; Second, \$1,000; Third, \$500; and Fourth, \$250. Population divisions are: up to 2500, from 2500 to 10,000 and above 10,000. An extra \$250 bonus award will be made to one of the prize winners.

Names of the winners will be announced on or before June 1, 1956. Each contestant must submit at least three months in advance of that date a complete record, in scrapbook form, of its accomplishments. Prize money will be used for Community improvements.

A great variety of projects have been undertaken by the competing communities, ranging from traffic improvement and parking programs to the building of a Little League baseball

field. A goal of one rural contestant is to obtain a resident physician. Towns in the smallest population class must undertake at least one project, the middle-population class must undertake at least two, and the large-city group has a minimum of three projects.

Communities competing in the contest, which is the first of its kind held in Pennsylvania, are fairly evenly divided among the population classes. In the top category are 64 cities, including Philadelphia and Pittsburgh; in the middle group, 83; and in the small-town group, 67.

Governor Leader and Senators Martin and Duff have warmly endorsed the contest. In addition, two electric companies (Pennsylvania Power and Light Co. and West Penn Power Co. have announced they will match any prize won by communities in their areas.)

The Mount Joy Chamber of Commerce is entered in the contest.

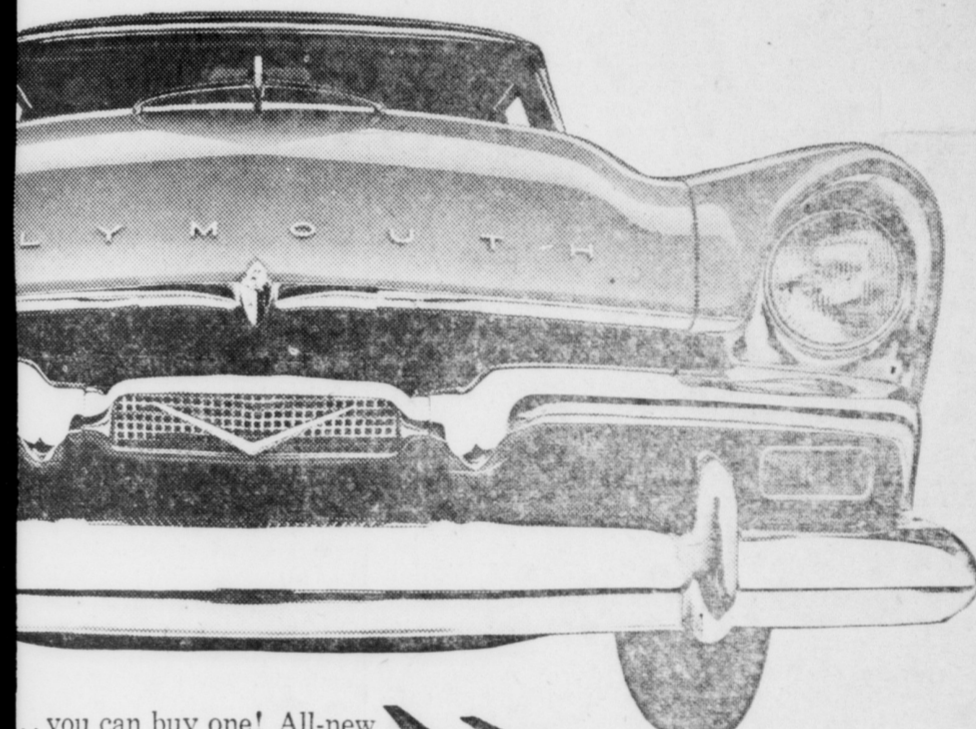

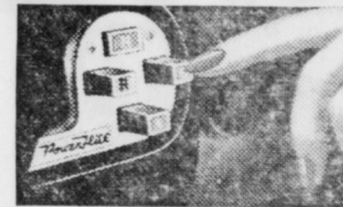

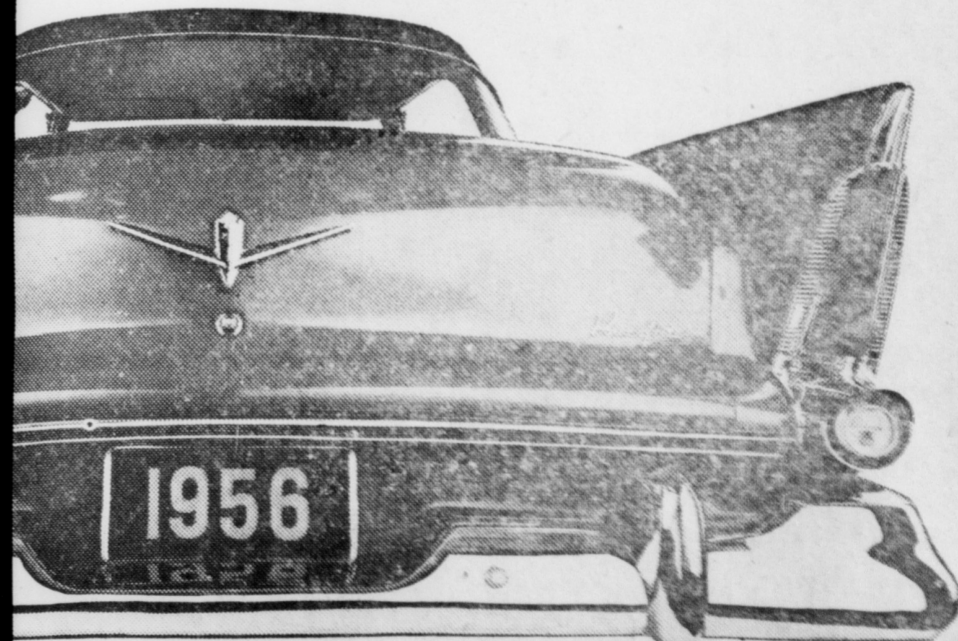
