

### E-Town Man Wins Plowing Contest

After having had to be postponed twice because of inclement weather, the plowing contest held in conjunction with the Mount Joy Community Exhibit was held last Thursday afternoon at the fields of John Melhorn, Marietta Ave. A. Lincoln Keener, Elizabethtown R1, totaled 305.4 points out of a possible 340 to win the first

plowing contest to be held in Lancaster County.

Keener is a former state champion potato picker. Runner up was Warren Miller, Mount Joy R1, who totaled 2828 pts.

All contestants used their own tractors and plows. Other contestants in the order of finish were Kenneth Eshelman, Elizabethtown R1; Ray Miller, Mt. Joy R2; Wilmer Kreider, Marietta R1; Jerry Brandt, Maytown; Raymond Herf, Mt. Joy R2; Eugene Kreider, Mt. Joy R2; Melvin Sager, Mt. Joy R1; Jerome Bixler, of Elizabethtown R3; David Shaffner, Mt. Joy R1; and Daniel

Heisey, Landisville.

Henry Woodling and Morris Schroeder, engineers from the Pennsylvania State University, laid out the strips and supervised the contest.

Points awarded on the basis of back furrow, conformation, finishing furrow, corners and ends, good trash coverage, uniform depth, uniform width and safe operation.

The panel of judges consisted of F. A. Bucher, A. G. Bucher, Paris Gruber, Norman Reber, and T. M. Malin. William Risser was in charge of the event.
