P. P. & L. REPORTS ON EARNINGS

Pro forma consolidated earnings of Pennsylvania Power and Light Company (including earnings of the former Pennsylvania Water & Power Company prior to June 1955 restated on the basis it was actually merged on June 1, 1955) and its subsidiary, The Scranton Electric Co., accruing to the common stock of Pennsylvania Power & Light Company for the twelve months ended September 30, 1955 were \$18,012,724, equivalent to \$3.05 per share of common stock outstanding at such date, as compared with \$16,964,489 or \$2.90 per share on the same pro forma consolidated basis for the twelve months ended Sept. 30, 1954.

Pro forma consolidated revenues for the twelve months ended Sept. 30, 1955 were \$120,211,777, an increase of 7.4 percent over the pro forma revenues for the previous year.

are seeking the office of supervisor. One will be elected, Jno. Sweitzer, Democrat; and Casper Eater, Republican, are seeking the office of auditor. One will be elected, Earl L. White, Republican, is running unopposed for constable.

In the Lincoln Schoolhouse district, George Kibler, Democrat; and Charles Gellham, Republican, are candidates for the office of judge of elections. One will be chosen, George Raub, Democrat and Elmer McKain, Republican, are candidates for the one position of inspector of elections. In the Maytown district, Dale Arnold, Republican, is running unopposed for the position of judge of election, North L. Loucks, Democrat and Miss Marie Harter, Republican, are seeking the one office of inspector of elections. In the Springville district (Florin), Paul Weiser, Republican, is running unopposed for judge of elections and Donald Staley, Republican, is running unopposed for inspector of election.

Lower Mount Joy Township Candidates

Since the "upper" portion of Mount Joy Township has been included in the Elizabethtown area, the lower or Milton Grove district candidates are listed. E. Musser Heisey, Republican, and Clarence Hollinger, Republican, are seeking two offices of schoolboard directors; Henry O'Neil, Republican, is running unopposed for Justice of the Peace; Joseph Greiner, Democrat and Lloyd Risser, Republican, are seeking the office of supervisor. One will be elected, Franklin Eichler, Democrat and Paul M. Hess, Republican, are seeking the office of auditor. One will be elected.

Jonas Linard, Republican, Sylvester Swords, Republican; and Ralph Sauders, Democrat are candidates for the office of constable. Two will be elected. Grover Eichler, Democrat, is running unopposed for inspector of elections.

East Donegal To Vote On Indebtedness

The residents of East Donegal Township will vote on the question of increasing the school district's indebtedness by \$80,000 at a special election to be held in conjunction with the November 8 election.

A booklet entitled "We Have a Problem" shows that since 1952 the school population in both the Washington School at Florin and the Maytown building has increased from 340 to 534 students. About 3000 booklets have been distributed to parents to familiarize patrons with the situation.

The patrons are informed that the board recommends the remodeling project of the unused old elementary building since it is the most economical, practical and quickest way of obtaining the needed facilities and since the retirement of the present bonds will be completed within two years, the cost of the proposed project can be met with no increase in the amount budgeted for debt service and, therefore, no additional tax would be needed. A six-room addition to either the present buildings would cost between \$180,000 and \$200,000 while a new six-room building will cost between \$225,000 and \$275,000.

Wickenheiser's Herd Is Tested For Yield

A. W. Wickenheiser, Mount Joy, is the owner of cows that were tested recently by the official Herd Improvement Registry program of the Holstein Association of America.

The cows were milked twice daily with an average milk yield of 11.678; average butterfat yield of 4.25; and average quarts of milk daily, 17. Nineteen cows were tested.

The figures indicating the average production of each cow in the herd, computed on a basis of milk received divided by the number of cows in the herd. Under the rules of the association, the entire herd must be tested. Testing was supervised by the Pennsylvania State University in cooperation with the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.
