**ANNUAL THANK OFFERING SERVICE AT TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH**

On Sunday evening, Nov. 13, at 7:00 p.m., the Women's Missionary Society of Trinity Lutheran Church will hold its annual Thank Offering Service.



The Rev. Fred J. Fiedler, D. D., will bring the message. Dr. Fiedler is Executive Secretary with the Board of Foreign Missions of the United Lutheran Church in America, with offices in New York City. Dr. Fiedler, by virtue of his office, will be able to give us a glimpse of the mission fields of the Lutheran Church throughout the world. As a former missionary to India, having served there from 1921 to 1929 he has a sympathetic understanding of missionary's problems. Having served as pastor of the St. Mark's Lutheran Church, Birdsboro, Pa., from 1930 to 1938, he knows the average congregation's attitude and response toward the missionary causes of the church. But he is not only a world missionary and congregational pastor. He has served his church in the area of social missions as well, having been superintendent and pastor of the Lutheran Inner Mission Society of Reading, Pa., and vicinity from 1939 to 1944. He has been the editor of "The Foreign Missionary," the Board official magazine, and "The Uncle Missionary Let-

ters," used in Sunday Schools throughout the church, and author of "Then the Light Came," a study book on India.

The choir of Trinity will assist in the service and Miss Adele Hill of Lancaster, will sing a negro spiritual and "The Lord's Prayer." There will be the annual presentation of Life Memberships and the gathering of the Thank Offering for missions.
