

LOCAL MERCHANTS TO GIVE \$1,000 IN PRIZES TO SHOPPERS

Directors Discuss Ways To Interest Industry

Board of directors of the Mt. Joy Chamber of Commerce Tuesday night discussed ways of interesting industry in locating in the area.

Jerry Mulloy, assistant secretary of the Lancaster Chamber of Commerce was present to offer suggestions and to explain the work being done by the Lancaster Chamber of Commerce along these lines on a county-wide basis.

Mr. Mulloy urged activation of a committee to gather all available information about Mt. Joy and its resources, so that persons seeking industrial sites can be supplied with necessary data quickly.

Thomas Pennypacker and Norman Hartman, representing Pennsylvania Power and Light Company, also were present, and offered assistance of the utility in compiling and listing pertinent information about sites in the Mount Joy area.

Mr. and Mrs. Sam Musser, who are planning the construction of a radio station between Elizabethtown and Maytown, were present to explain their plans to the board. At present there are three applications pending for a radio station to serve this area. Hearings are scheduled to start in January to determine awarding of the permit.

RCA OFFICIAL ADDRESSES ROTARY

Following his discharge today he will reside with his parents on Donegal Springs Road and will work with his father in the Mount Joy Department Store, East Main Street.

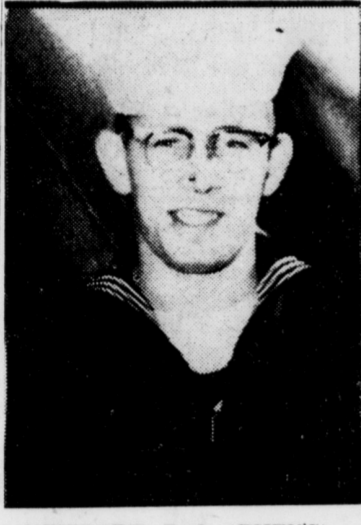
TYPING STUDENTS IN CHARGE OF BANKING

Power Capacity Being Increased By P. P. & L.

Pennsylvania Power & Light Company is engaged in a distribution line reconstruction project that will substantially increase the capacity of PP&L facilities in the borough of Mt. Joy, T. G. Pennypacker, PP&L district manager at Columbia, reported today.

This \$50,000 project converts the present 2300-volt facilities in the borough to operate as part of PP&L's high capacity 12,000-volt system. Under the new setup, the Mount Joy substation, which is now supplying the borough, will no longer be used when the project is completed. The job involves re-insulation of the lines for the higher voltage operation, replacement of some poles, conductors and transformers throughout the area being converted, and installation of additional conductors. In addition, other incidental work is being done to bring facilities up to present day standards.

The project will require several months to complete. It is the final step in a long-range post-war program of increasing the capacity of the distribution facilities in Mount Joy, Florin and the outlying areas in East and West Donegal, Mount Joy and Rapho townships. The total program has involved an expenditure of more than \$125,000 and is part of the local utility's construction program constantly underway throughout its Central Eastern Pennsylvania service area.
