HARRISBURG ROUND-UP

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania's General Assembly this week embarked upon the second stage of consideration of the Governor's proposed manufacturers' excise tax following approval of the tax plan last week by the administration-dominated House of Representatives. Indications continue to point to eventual approval of the tax plan — after modifications — by the Republican-controlled Senate. The main point at the moment is to slow down the haste with which the levy was huddled through the lower chamber last week.

A spokesman for the State Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation pointed out this week that thousands of Pennsylvania residents who fall into the category of disabled workers are not taking advantage of the rehabilitation program available to them. Such retraining is available to residents under 15 years of age who have sustained employment handicaps.

The Pennsylvania Department of Health's anti-air pollution program is now rolling along in high gear, according to the Department of Health which noted that a mobile air testing laboratory on wheels is continually checking the possibility of injurious wastes dispersed into the air. Specialized instruments and personnel are used in the lab-on-wheels.

Once silicotic lesions have developed, chances of a cure are quite remote, the Pennsylvania Department of Health warned this week in urging workers whose dusts carry them into airborne dust areas, to have a check-up in the early stages of development of silicosis. Early arrest of the progress of the disease on the other hand, the department noted can mean a prolonging of life and general health.

So-called "secret cures" for human ailments were vigorously opposed this week by Pennsylvania osteopaths, with a spokesman for the Pennsylvania Osteopathic Association asserting that it was unalterably opposed to any cures for human ailments whose values have not been scientifically demonstrated. The association said it was striking in particular at non-medical cancer cures.

Pennsylvania safety officials this week cautioned motorists of the Keystone State to "take it easy" during holiday driving this month with the approach of the Christmas holiday season. It was noted in particular that during the month of December automobile accidents on Pennsylvania's highways take an upswing.

Full support of local cancer or tumor clinics at community hospitals was urged this week by the Department of Health as the best means of practical cancer control yet devised where staffs and equipment are available that otherwise would not be.
