800 KEYSTONE COMMUNITIES HAVE RECREATION PROGRAM

Harrisburg - PNS - Some-what surprising perhaps is the fact that today Pennsylvania has more than 800 communities taking part in various types of recreation programs of one sort or another.

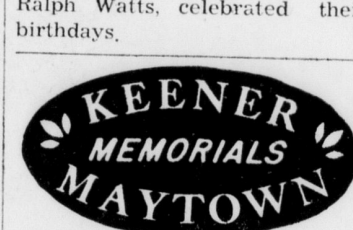
On the whole most of these playground programs however are summer playground programs, according to the State Department of Public Instruction, although on the other hand there are many communities providing year-round recreation programs, the spokesman told Penna. News Service.

The state helps pay the way in many cases, and it is interesting to note perhaps that the 1953 Legislature eliminated all recreation for adults from the various recreational extension programs conducted by the department—while several lawmakers in the current session have backed legislation that would set up a special Department of Recreation.

As matters stand now, extension recreation applies only to youths under 21 years of age. It was pointed out that recreation skills must be learned with the school, beginning with kindergarten, and that schools must perform certain functions heretofore in many communities throughout the state.

POSTMASTER GIVES HELPFUL HINTS ON YULE MAILING

Reporting that his "Mail Early for Christmas" campaign is really in high gear, Postmaster Elmer L. Zerpey today gave some helpful hints on how you can be sure that your Xmas cards will reach everyone on your list before Dec. 25.

"When you use three cent stamps on your Christmas card, you get first-class mail service," he said, "first-class friends deserve first-class mail and the use of first-class postage makes it certain that your Christmas cards will be delivered promptly. Also, use of first-class postage insures forwarding service, if the addressee has moved or if the card will be returned to you if the recipient cannot be located. Then, too, on Christmas cards sent by first-class mail, you can include handwritten messages making your greeting more personal."

It is perfectly correct and, in fact, advisable to include your return name and address on each Christmas card envelope. This helps your friends to keep their mailing list up-to-date and insures correction of your list if the card is returned as undeliverable.

Postmaster Zerpey warns that if any of your Christmas card envelopes are larger than 9x12 inches or smaller than 2 1/4 by 4 inches they must be sent by first-class mail because such cards require hand cancellation.

When your Christmas cards are ready to mail, you will do both yourself and Postmaster a real favor by putting the cards with local addresses in one bundle and those for out-of-town destinations in another. Then mark each bundle with special identification labels you can get free at the Post Office which read "All for out-of-town delivery" and "All for local delivery."

If you have a large card list mail your out-of-town cards several days in advance of those for local delivery and try to get all cards for distant points mailed by Dec. 15 and those for local delivery should be started on their way at least a week before Christmas.

Regarding the mailing of Christmas gifts, Postmaster Elmer Zerpey points out that right now the big double rush is beginning with the out-going Christmas mails paralleling the flood of incoming packages and Christmas cards. He urges that you get your out-of-state packages into the Post Office within the next day or two and do everything possible to mail all of your Christmas gifts for local delivery by Dec. 10.

The Postmaster said that he would appreciate cooperation from all business firms to delay the mailing of circulars and catalogs until after Dec. 25th. He also suggested that they step up their regular correspondence mailings to 4 P. M. or earlier each day.
