The Pennsylvania Story

Harrisburg — That passel of public hearings the Republican Senate staged last week on Governor Leader's proposed manufacturers excise tax is still somewhat the chat of the town here in Harrisburg this week.

Reason for this is that the hearings turned out to be somewhat embarrassing - primarily from the standpoint that an almost endless parade of witnesses opposed the levy, while those favoring the tax had to be rustled from the bushes by sounding the gong twice.

In fact the only noble souls who came to the defense of the tax proposal were State Democratic Senator John H. Dent

administration leader in the upper legislative chamber, and the Governor's own brother, Henry B. Leader, the Governor's legislative aide.

As matters stood on the hearing bench, the parade of industrial brass opposing the tax seemed to be more of a page out of a Chamber of Commerce brochure than anything else.

We understand one industrial lad slunk up here from Philadelphia with the idea of putting in a good word for the tax on his business - but when he discovered that he would have been just about the only one from industry appearing on the positive side of the fence, he beat a rather hasty and frustrated retreat to the wailing arms of the City of Brotherly Love.

Unquestionably though the tax hearings tended to underscore an oft-made point, to wit: no tax is ever regarded as a justifiable or "fair" tax.

To those who have to pay the tax the levy almost always appears in the light of an unnecessary, unjustified and evil thing.

The classified income tax advocated by Mr. Leader in the more tender days of his administration this year is perhaps a classic example. That tax would have hit just about everyone who enjoyed a small pittance - yes, even the writer.

The clamor was astounding and deafening - even to the hard lobed ears of Democratic strategists. Nary a squawk was heard from industry however.

Now comes this latest prize - the manufacturers excise tax - and industry sets up a howl just about unprecedented, other than that whisky tax rebellion in the western part of the state during colonial days.

Seemingly in this latest tax venture the main point has been somewhat overlooked insofar as the negative side of the tax is concerned. This is the point:

No other state has such a tax. Governor Leader, in alluding to the good points in favor of the levy, notes that Canada has had extremely good fortune with the tax.

All very well up to this point. Canada is an entire country. Pennsylvania is only one-forty-eighth of an entire country.

To place the tax in effect on Pennsylvania industry unquestionably would build an economic-industrial barrier difficult to hurdle with other competing states. A nationwide manufacturers excise tax placing all in the case of Canada - is something else. Pennsylvania isn't Canada by far.

These short courses, which are taught by the faculty of the College of Agriculture, have proven very popular over the years both for persons experienced in farming and for those who were just starting to farm. Classes are made as practical as possible and much instruction is conducted in the laboratories, shops, and barns of the University.

In the General Farming course, the following subjects are emphasized: Farm Machinery and Tractors; Farm Mechanics; Forage Crops and Pastures; Grain Crops; Poultry Farming; Rural Economics and Social Problems; and Soils and Fertilizers.
