LOCAL BASE SERGEANT NAMED FOR OCS CLASS
M/Sgt. Karl Max, NCOIC of base Personnel Services, has been selected for Officers Candidate School at Lackland AFB. The class will convene during March.

Sergeant Max, whose home is Mount Joy, entered the Air Force in August, 1948, going thru basic training and flight chief's school at Lackland. He was a boxing instructor and the base welterweight champion during his stay at Lackland. In 1949 he won the Air Training Command lightweight crown.

In 1949, Sgt. Max was discharged. He was recalled to active duty in Jan., 1951, during the Korean conflict, and was assigned to McGuire AFB, N. J., as first sergeant of the 105th Flight Interceptor Squadron, he next went to McGhee-Tyson AFB, Tenn., and, in 1952, moved to the 5th Air Force Headquarters in Korea where he worked as the chief clerk of personnel services.

He returned to the United States in March, 1953 and was assigned as chief clerk of ADC Personnel Services, later moving to the ADC Inspector General's office.
