Highlighting the film is a photographic study of the traditional Pueblo dances, accompanied by an original musical score.

Also shown is the annual Indian festival at Gallup, New Mexico, where many Indian tribes from all over the Southwest gather to join in the colorful celebration.

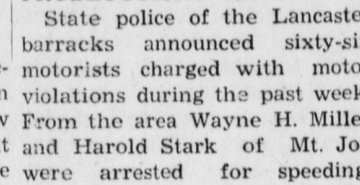

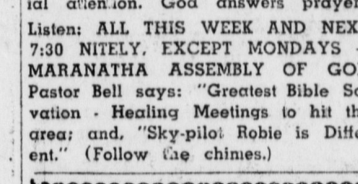
