The Pennsylvania Story

Harrisburg — Pennsylvania's State Senate unquestionably took a lordly step last week in somewhat of a fitful effort to ease its gastronomical ills when it went on record favoring cleaning up the day's legislative efforts by 6 P. M. each day—in order that the august members of that body might be free in time for dinner.

It seems that the late hours some of these gents have been keeping in the upper house — on legislative matters that is — during the past year of haggling, squabbling and accomplishing less, have had somewhat of a telling effect on the lawmakers.

Indigestion and other ills seem to be the order of the day—and unquestionably the consumption of burp pills by these learned politicians must be something frightful, almost as frightful as the legislative spectacle they have created during the past 13 months.

As we say, it is certainly a noble gesture. The thought of having our politicians uncomfortable or inconvenienced a teeny weeny bit — while ten million people throughout the state groan and writhe in agony and disgust at the bickering of the politicians and the resultant breakdown of Commonwealth services—is one of those things you just don't tolerate.

Before the last legislative day has flitted over the horizon, it probably will be a better than even chance that the best way to insure defeat is for a candidate to let it be known that he was a member of the 1955-56 session of the Legislature.

Unquestionably the State Senate has taken a step in the right direction to cure its own indigestion. It's the voter's turn next to take care of their indigestion.

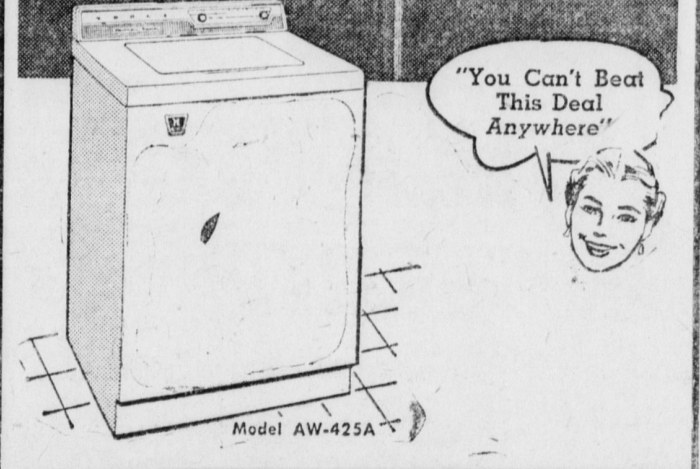
