**Stayman Apple Leads All Others**

HARRISBURG—PNS — The all-purpose Stayman variety of apples once more led all others in Pennsylvania production during the past year, the State Department of Agriculture said this week.

Considered excellent for eating fresh, for cooking and baking, the Stayman has been the leading apple for many years in the Keystone State.

Second in production last year was the York Imperial, popular with apple canners.

Delicious Rome Beauty, Jonathan apples ranked next in order for total production in Pennsylvania.

Reviewing the season, the department noted that there was a fairly good set of fruit on most varieties with favorable spring weather in most fruit areas of the state, followed by dry conditions later in the summer.

Late rains and a fairly good fall season helped improve prospects.

Production of Stayman apples during the year amounted to approximately 20 per cent of the total output of all varieties.
