REV. HENRY W. MACK SPEAKS HERE

The Rev. Henry W. Mack, Ph.D., Presbyterian missionary on furlough from the Philippines, spoke at the First Presbyterian Church of Mount Joy this Wednesday evening, January 25, at 7:45 o'clock. Mr. Mack is head of the Bible Department of Silliman University, Dumaguete, Philippines. This is one of the most important mission institutions in the country, and has a total enrollment of about 2800. In addition to the elementary and high school departments, there are seven colleges and a graduate school, as well as a rural education program with the purpose of economic and social improvement and stabilization of rural life in the community. One of Mr. Mack's major interests at Silliman has been Radio Station DYSR whose studios are on the campus. He is acting director of the station and responsible for the planning of many of its programs. Sponsored by the Philippine Federation of Christian Churches and licensed for non-commercial broadcasting only, it offers numerous religious programs, worship services, Bible classes, and sacred music hours.

DR. DAVID M. CORY SPEAKING SUNDAY

Dr. David M. Cory will be the speaker in the third session of the School of Missions this coming Sunday evening at 7:30 in the Elizabethtown Church of the Brethren. His topic will be "The Church's Responsibility for the American Indian". Dr. Cory is the author of "Within Two Worlds which is being used by Protestant Churches as the textbook in this year's study of the Indian American. Pastor of the Cuyler Presbyterian Church in Brooklyn from 1926 - 1955, Dr. Cory is at present the Executive Secretary of the Brooklyn Division of the Protestant Council of New York. He will also speak at 10 a. m. Sunday morning in the Mountville Church of the Brethren.
