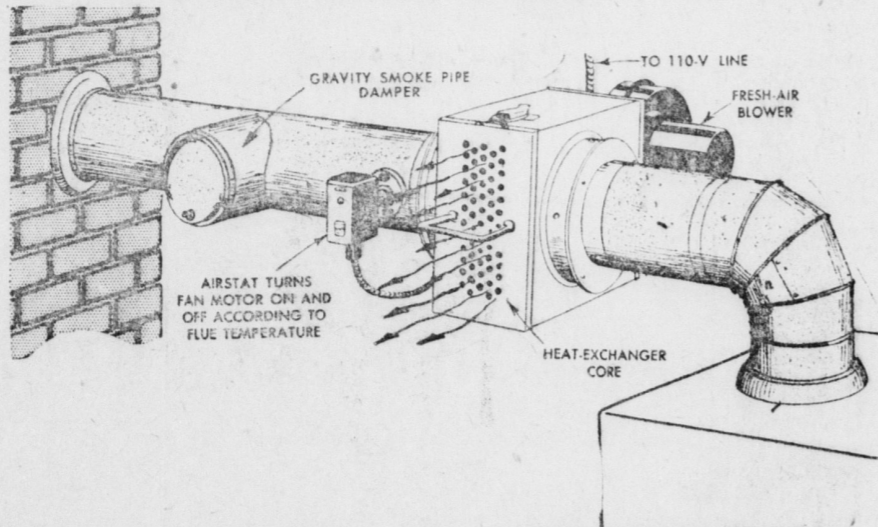
Some of the local places burglarized by the group were the Mount Joy Diner, the Church of God, Landisville; and the Manheim Lutheran Church.
