President Eisenhower sent the nomination of Elmer L. Zerphery as postmaster of the borough to the Senate for confirmation last Wednesday. Mr. Zerphery has been acting postmaster in town since July 1, 1953.

**Legislative Round-Up**

Harrisburg—The State Legislature this week goes into its fourteenth months of sessioning—still without a budget-and-tax program mapped out for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Defeat of the sales tax proposal in the House of Representatives in its first real trial run through the Assembly came as a surprise to no one.

It can be called up again within five legislative days and as the newly appointed joint Republican - Democratic House tax committee this week sat down for closed door sessions the chances are viewed as quite good that it will figure in these deliberations.

Whether this special bipartisan committee can hammer out a success story tax program agreeable to not only both sides of the aisle in the House but also the balking GOP-dominated Senate is something no one dares predict.

It is generally conceded that this committee is just about the final hope for working out any sort of agreeable tax program for this session.

Should this move prove unsuccessful, there is talk of the Legislature adjoining and letting the Governor call the lawmakers back into special session to consider only one thing: a tax.

In other actions by the Legislature, Pennsylvania's lawmakers in the Senate refused to concur on House amendments to the FEPC pension-plan exemption and the annual sessions proposal. On the other hand the Senate has approved a House bill proposing a Constitutional amendment to permit absentee voting.

In the House, lawmakers killed off permanently for this session a bill that would have permitted public sales of liquor until 2 A. M. Sundays, while another House bill setting unit cost limits on school authority construction eligible for state reimbursement was passed by the lower chamber.

Elsewhere on the legislative front a few new bills made their appearance during the week including those which would:

Require builders of dwelling or housing units to give bond to guarantee against defective workmanship and material;

Further regulate the appointment of auditors in union school districts;

Amend the Public School Code by requiring the acquisition and display of the Pennsylvania State Flag;

Prohibit the carrying of firearms by hunters after they have killed a legal big animal;

Limit liability of children for support of parents deserting them during minority;

Change the permissible weight variance for dump trucks transporting excavated materials;

Prohibit the issuance of operators' licenses and learners' permits to persons under eighteen years of age.

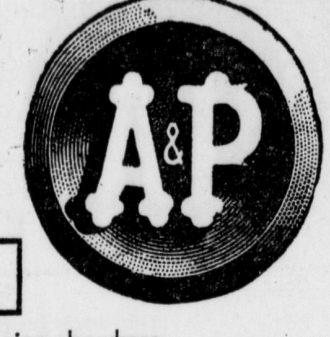
