pipes of all types is 116,415 feet; the length of the Mt. Joy sewers is estimated at 105,030 feet. The Sewage Plant at Palmyra was designed for 500,000 gallons per day; the capacity of the Mt. Joy plant is the same. It is, of course, impossible to compare two projects, side by side, as the conditions may be very different in each case. For instance, Mt. Joy has only one pumping station whereas Palmyra had several. Mt. Joy will discharge directly into Little Chiques Creek whereas Palmyra pumped more than a mile to discharge into a creek lying on the east. But the figures show that the Mt. Joy plant is cheaper in cost than any other comparable installations. The one unfortunate circumstance is that there are so few people in Mt. Joy who will be potential customers for the sewer system. As time goes on and new homes are built this drawback will disappear. The Mt. Joy plant is capable of handling 4,400 people.

The attention of the meeting was also given to a copy of a letter written by John B. Rengier of the law firm of Rengier and Musser, dated February 3 in which he put the Authority on notice that a petition is being circulated in the Borough in an effort to change the location of the sewage treatment plant from its present location on the lot owned by the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

The realization that there would be organized resistance to the construction of Sewer System as planned, came as a bomb - shell to the Authority members. After all the expressed evidence on the part of Mt. Joy by people that they want a Sewer System and want it soon, it now seemed that hopes of getting started on the system were fading. All the members agreed something has to be done and done quickly. In the balance hangs the possibility of losing low bidders at a loss of nearly \$100,000.00. The Bidders can be held for only thirty days, and then they must be released from their bids. Before the bankers will agree to underwrite the Bond Issue, the Sewer Treatment Plant bids must be taken and the cost of the entire project acceptable to the bankers, who market the Bonds. If the plant cannot be built at the location planned at the V.F.W. lot on the east side of Longenecker Road, then the entire project must be re-bid, and the present favorable bids lost.

The Authority therefore is trying to arrange a meeting with the people who object to the Sewer Treatment Plant location. If an amicable settlement can be reached, then the Sewer System can be started using the present location. If no decision can be reached whereby the possibility of holding up the project can be averted, then either the Sewer System will have to be dropped for the present or an alternative plan worked out.

The cost of alternative locations may well be costly to the people of Mount Joy. At the present low bids, it has been roughly estimated by the Engineer that the system can be built at a cost of around \$7.00 per front foot assessment, \$125.00 fee to connect to the curb from the sewer and a sewer rental of about \$50.00 per year. These figures compare with assessments as high as \$14.00 per front foot and yearly rentals as high as \$70.00 in other places. The Authority voiced the hope that all of the work and effort that has been put into the planning of the Sewer System to date will not be wasted.

As one Authority Member expressed it, "no one wants a fire plug, or a light pole in front of their property, yet everyone wants fire protection and electric service." The same thing goes for a Sewer Treatment Plant. No one wants one of them within eyesight either. But here again the needs of many must supercede the wishes of the few and some compromise in the form of a financial settlement should be worked out. "Of course," said the same Member, "we can go out of town to build the Plant, but then Mt. Joy citizens will have to pay for the added cost in higher yearly sewer rentals."
