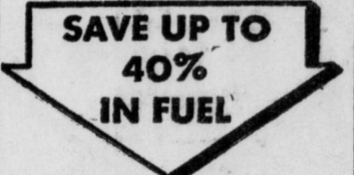
Ken Depoe, Basketball Coach at Donegal High, was honored at the annual reunion of the St. Joseph's Catholic Club Old-timers Association.
