

### Name Chairman For Hospital Big Gifts Drive

Co-Chairmen in the Elizabethtown, Marietta, Mount Joy and Columbia area of the county big gifts division of Lancaster General Hospital's 1956 charity and replacement campaign were announced today. They were Paul M. Grubb, Elizabethtown, and Ralph W. Snaveley, Landisville.

Appointments were announced by E. Day Ressler and Samuel S. Wenger, Esq., co-chairmen of the drive's county big gifts division.

Grubb and Snaveley will coordinate the activities of the division in the entire western section of the county, including the Townships of Conoy, Mount

Joy, West Donegal, East Donegal, West Hempfield, East Hempfield, Manor, and the boroughs of Mount Joy, Elizabethtown, Mountville, Millersville, Marietta, and East Petersburg. They will be assisted by volunteer workers in each of the townships and boros of the area. ### Cattle Tested By Holstein Group

Announcement has been received from the Holstein-Friesian Association of America of the completion of a yearly herd average on the registered Holstein cows belonging to A. W. Wickenheiser, Mount Joy, R.D.; and Harvey Rettew, Manheim R.D.

Mr. Wickenheiser's Loevale Leader Roma produced 13,992 pounds of milk and 536 pounds of butterfat. She was milked twice daily for 338 days and yielded an average of 19 qts. At the time testing began, she was four years, four months

old. Mr. Rettew's herd of six cows produced an average of 12,712 pounds of milk and 480 pounds of butterfat. They were
