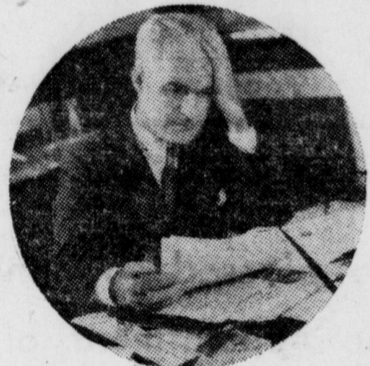

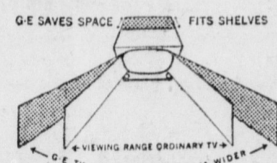

John F. Reese, Lancaster, was the guest speaker at the Monday night meeting of the local B.P.W. Club at Hostetter's. Mr. Reese, who is a member of the New York stock exchange, gave a talk on stock markets and investments and also showed a film on "Common Stock".

Dr. and Mrs. John Stauffer sang three vocal duets during the program and Miss Dorothy Schock led the group in singing. Mrs. Adam Greer, chairman of the finance committee, was in charge of the program. Husbands and friends were guests at the Monday meeting.

Three new members, Miss Helen Schule, Mrs. Helen Wealand and Mrs. Marian Risser, were accepted into the group.

During the business meeting, the group decided to donate \$25 to the Women's Medical College in Philadelphia. This is a state project which is supported by the state B.P.W. groups. She announced that a state office will be set up in Harrisburg April 1 with an executive secretary in attendance. She also announced that the group is sponsoring a movement to have the song "Pennsylvania" adopted as the state song.

ship program operate within the framework of the counties named for the present time. This service will be extended to other territory just as soon as the public school system and the dollar value of business therein justifies such extension.

4. The ONLY eligible applicants for a SICO Scholarship are those high school graduates who need financial assistance and who have firmly decided that their career is that of a teacher in the elementary grades of the public schools where a great shortage of competent teachers exists and is likely to continue to exist for many years to come. Application blanks for the SICO Four-year Scholarship can be secured from high school principals.

5. The SICO Scholarship winners are selected by examinations conducted by the four State Teachers Colleges; namely Millersville, Shippensburg, Kutztown and West Chester. The State Teachers College will notify the students living within its service area as to time and place to appear for qualifying examinations. The SICO Foundation Scholarship is a free scholarship in the amount of \$300 per year for four years. SICO will pay the amount of the Scholarships to the colleges as and when required by the colleges.

6. Just what does SICO expect of its scholarship winners? It would hope for more and better teachers in the elementary schools. It means a better chance for higher education for financially underprivileged students with ability. It means that a great dream has been shared and has brought a more abundant life to ourselves and our children.

7. Officers of The SICO Company will conduct seminars each year at each of the four State Teachers Colleges to explain the SICO Foundation Scholarships. In this way at each college the story of SICO can be told, explaining how the SICO Scholarships are a direct result of Clarence Schock's deep interest in education and his desire that worthy high school graduates eager and willing to become teachers in the elementary grades but who lack funds can have opportunity to attend State Teachers College.

8. Whenever a SICO Scholarship has been granted, it may be withdrawn, withheld or terminated whenever the President or other executive head of the college where such student is in attendance, shall in his discretion recommend.

Past Scholarships

At the present time there are ninety-three students in the 4 state teachers colleges with SICO scholarships. There are 50 in Millersville; 24 in Shippensburg; 5 in Kutztown and 5 in West Chester.

Forty-six students are from Lancaster County; 6 from Barks; 6 from Chester; 12 from Cumberland; 13 from Dauphin; 4 from Lebanon and 6 from York.

Not included in the figures are 46 students who have finished their college course and have been graduated, who were recipients of the scholarships.

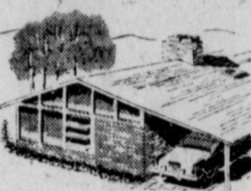
