

Enrollment Day Is April 4th For Hempfield Schools

Pre-school enrollment day for the Hempfield Joint Schools will be April 4, 1956, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Walter H. Reese, supervising principal, stated today.

Purpose of enrollment day is to register and enroll all pupils entering the first grade who are not now enrolled in kindergarten in addition to those children who will enter kindergarten in the 1956-57 school year.

A pre-school maturity test will be administered to all these pupils who are not presently enrolled in kindergarten.

Birth certificates and vaccination certificates should be presented when the pupils are registered for kindergarten or first grade.

Age requirements are: Kindergarten - child must be five years old on or before January 31, 1957; first grade - child must be six years old on or before Jan. 31, 1957.

Screening tests for pupils entering the first grade will be given at the following hours: 8:45 a.m., 9:45 a.m., 10:45 a.m., 12:45 p.m.

Parents having first grade pupils who are not now enrolled in kindergarten should appear for registration and screening during the hours designated. There will be no school for kindergarten, first grade and second grade on this registration day.

Parents are requested to register children at the elementary school nearest their home. They are as follows: Landisville elementary school, East Petersburg elementary school, Rohrerstown elementary school, Mountville elementary school and Farmdale elementary school.

97 Examined At Clinic During February

At the six diagnostic clinics held in February, 97 patients were examined by the orthopedic surgeons, P. David Nutter, M. D., and Marvin C. Goodman M.D. There were 31 new patients admitted to the service of the Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Inc., 129 E. Orange St., Lancaster, Pa.

Seventeen children attended the Pre-school Cerebral Palsy Center for the concentrated services of psychological evaluation and guidance, for kindergarten teaching, for speech, occupational and physical therapy.

Nine children attended the Corrective Swimming Class held at the YWCA - a Red Feather Agency.

Orthopedic follow-up, occupational and physical therapy treatments were given to handicapped individuals in their homes and in the Treatment Center. 371 visits were made in giving these services in February.

Approximately 225 hours of volunteer service was given by individuals and drivers at the Pre-school Cerebral Palsy Center, Board members, Venture Club, Junior League, Shrine Club, volunteer drivers for Craft Class and friends of crippled children offered their services to the Society.

The Community Chest loaned the Society typewriters and did multilithing for the Society.

WANTED BY THE FBI



Charles Edward Ranel

Charles Edward Ranel, one of the most recent additions to the FBI's list of Ten Most Wanted Fugitives, has the letters "Hard" tattooed on back of fingers on his right hand, and the letters "Luck" tattooed on back of fingers on his left hand, and he means just that—"Hard Luck," not only to those with whom he comes in contact but also to himself.

Since he was fifteen years old Ranel has led a lawless life which consistently involves the display of discharge of firearms. His first arrest was for car theft, and he was confined at a state institution. Ranel escaped and subsequently was convicted for kidnapping, robbery with firearms, and aiding a prisoner to escape.

In 1951, he was confined to prison at Huntsville, Texas, after being sentenced for robbery and was discharged in 1953. During his incarceration he became closely associated with a notorious burglar, Maynard Hollandsworth.

On October 27, 1954, two armed men entered a bank at Louisville, Kentucky. Both wore gloves and while one bandit kept the employees under control by pointing a long barreled, blue, steel revolver at them, the second gunman scooped the money from the cash drawers. The Chief Teller was ordered to open the vault, and the safe robber completely filled a briefcase which he was carrying.

An unusual feature of the robbery was the getaway. Usually the bandits' car is parked in front of the bank. In this case although both men entered by the front, door they walked through the bank and escaped with thirty-five thousand dollars in a car which they parked at the rear door. The descriptions of the two bandits coincided closely with those of two individuals who had held up a supermarket in Louisville three weeks before, and the method of operation was so similar that police were convinced the robbers in both cases were identical. The investigation and identifications established Ranel and Hollandsworth as the bandits.

On December 7, 1954, Hol-

landsworth was apprehended at Biloxi, Miss., but Ranel was not found.

On May 18, 1955, a lone gunman held up a grocery store in Texarkana, Arkansas, and nine days later a lone bandit armed with a revolver held up the Citizens Bank and Trust Company, Lone Oak, Kentucky, and escaped with nine thousand and seven hundred dollars in cash. Panels was identified as the holdup man in both cases.

This clearly proves the theory that police have had about this individual for years. He will hold up a bank just as he will hold up a small grocery store. His need for money appears to be the sole determining factor regarding the choice and location of his victims.

The FBI has a warrant for Ranel's arrest charging him with Bank Robbery, but warns that everyone should understand that this fugitive is a dangerous character, has always been known to carry firearms, has shot at arresting officers on occasion, and must be approached with the utmost caution.

Ranel was born April 14, 1922 at Conroe, Texas. He is five feet seven inches tall, weighing one hundred fifty pounds, medium build, brown hair and eyes. He has numerous scars and tattoos, including a cut scar over the left eyebrow, cut scar middle of upper lip, cut scar on bridge of nose; tattoos, includes bird with "Love" on outer side of left arm, "T. L." and heart on outer side of left forearm, bird and "T.M.L." on inner left forearm, skull clasped hands and "R.A. Charlie" on outer side of right upper arm. Ranel has been employed as a bookkeeper, truck driver, and a fireman.

Captain Zeller, assistant operations officer in the 67th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, is a veteran of World War II and the Korean conflict. A member of Chi Phi fraternity, he was graduated from the U. S. Military Academy in 1945.

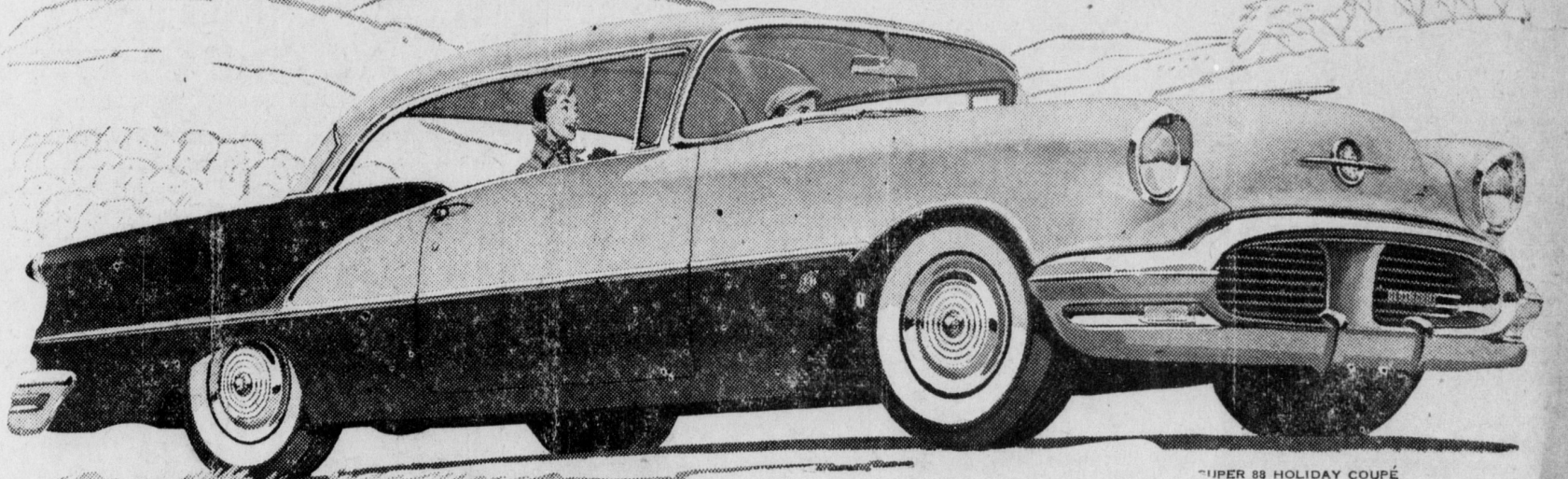

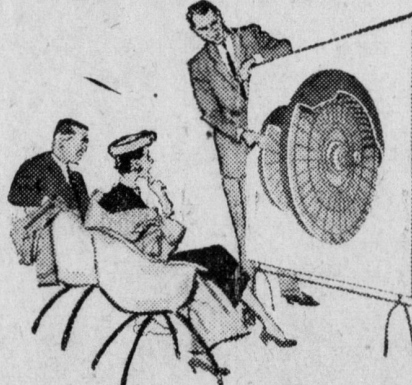

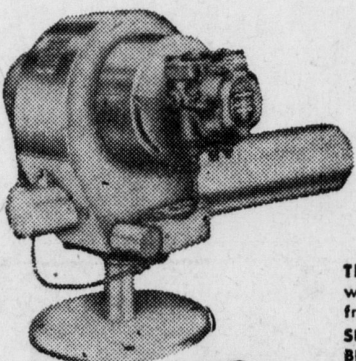
