Rotary Club Hears Talk On Sanitation

Importance of sanitation in raising the living standards of the American people was emphasized by Fred B. Jacobson who addressed Mount Joy Rotarians Tuesday noon on "Sanitation in the American Diet."

Mr. Jacobson declared in the past 50 years the average American's life expectancy has been increased by 20 years. He credited higher standards of living as brought about by improved sanitary conditions for a major portion of this increase.

The speaker pointed out that with half of this country's population deriving its income from the food industry in one of its many phases tremendous strides have been made in making food more sanitary.

He stated that introduction of sanitary methods almost invariably brings savings to those who institute those methods. He predicted that continued surpluses will bring even higher standards and subsequent increases in life expectancy.
