Four Diagnostic Clinics In March

Four diagnostic clinics were held in March with an attendance of 41. There were 16 new patients.

The orthopedic nurse, occupational and physical therapists made 230 visits to handicapped persons. Brace and shoe care and instruction was given, exercises to meet the individual need, and the severely handicapped taught how to give themselves personal care. If the handicapped person is willing to work diligently, he learns to do many things which he may have thought were impossible.

Eight persons attended the Corrective Swimming Class with Mrs. Elva Shertzer and Mrs. Constance Reilly in charge assisted by Mrs. Charles Vogt and Mrs. Jack Gaston.

Illness and inclement weather affected the attendance at the Pre-school Cerebral Palsy Center. Twelve children attended during March. Volunteers under the leadership of Mrs. William Poorbaugh, assisted in the Center and volunteer drivers, under the leadership of Mrs. John I. Hartman, Jr. saw that the children were transported regularly. With the highly specialized services of psychological guidance and evaluation, kindergarten teaching and evaluation, speech, occupational and physical therapy given, definite progress is now measurable.

Eight individuals made regular visits to the Craft Class in the Treatment Center at 129 E. Orange Street, Lancaster. Miss Joanne Haines, occupational therapist, resigned March 16 to accept a position in Atlantic City, gave graciously of her time to the Pre-school Cerebral Palsy Center and Craft Class so that these activities were not without expert guidance until April 2 1956 when this position will be filled. The Craft Class held a social farewell for her at the Willows, on March 21.

Volunteers gave 508 hours to the work of the Society - the largest single group being the Easter Seal volunteers who gave 338 1/2 and the next largest, 81 hours by Mrs. "Kitty" Heisey.

Salunga Soldier In Maneuvers

Fort Carson, Colo. - Army PFC Paul R. Leed, 19, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd B. Leed, 169 Broad St., Salunga, Pa., is taking part in Exercise Lodes-tar Baker, a three-month maneuver at Fort Carson, Colo.

The exercise, scheduled to end later this month, is testing the skill of several thousand troops in simulated combat under cold weather conditions in mountainous terrain.

Leed is a member of the 77th Special Forces Group Airborne, regularly stationed at Fort Bragg, N. C. He is a radio operator in the unit. Leed entered the Army in June 1954 and completed basic training at Ft. Jackson, S. C.

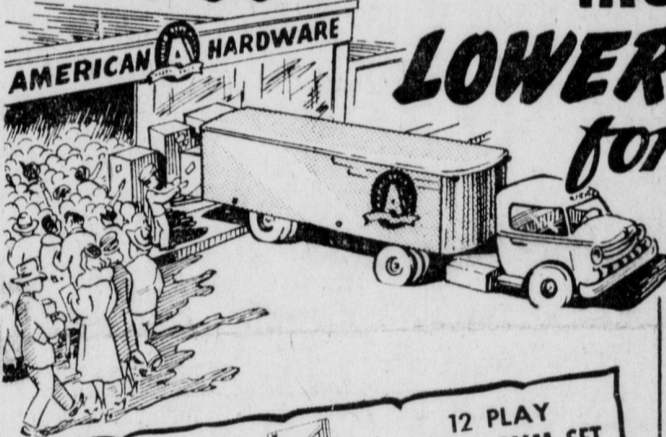

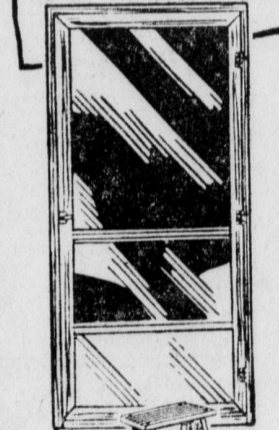
