Asked for her views on the recent criticism hurled by Russian leaders against Stalin, Mrs. Shirk said she believed it is an effort on their part to disassociate themselves from previous crimes.
To the question "What happened to the clergy?" Mrs. Shirk stated that most of them were liquidated, with the Communists permitting only the aged priests to live on the ground that they would be unable to create an effective opposition.
