Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Taft Benson today urged widespread participation in Soil Stewardship Week, May 6-12 and in Soil Stewardship Sunday which begins the observance on May 6. He said he is suggesting that all Department employees, "as good citizens of the communities in which they live and work, assist as appropriate in locally-planned activities during this week."

"All of us should have a daily awareness of the spiritual values of conserving and wisely using soil, water, plants, and wildlife," the Secretary said. "The forthcoming observance is a special time in which conservation groups, farm, church, youth, and civic organizations will join in helping to create this awareness by all our citizens."

Local soil conservation districts throughout the nation are sponsoring the observance in cooperation with local and national church leaders. An advisory committee representing the National Council of Churches of Christ in the U.S.A., the National Catholic Rural Life Conference, Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., and the National Lutheran Council aided the National Association of Soil Conservation Districts in planning the national observance.

We in the Department of Agriculture sincerely welcome the spiritual help this special week will give us in carrying out our responsibility to all our people for helping farmers and ranchers who wish to become better stewards of natural resources," the Secretary said. "We must be ever mindful that 'The Earth is the Lord's' Man is inseparable from its soil, water, and other resources. We are lifetime custodians of these natural resources, which must be passed on without dissipation to succeeding generations."

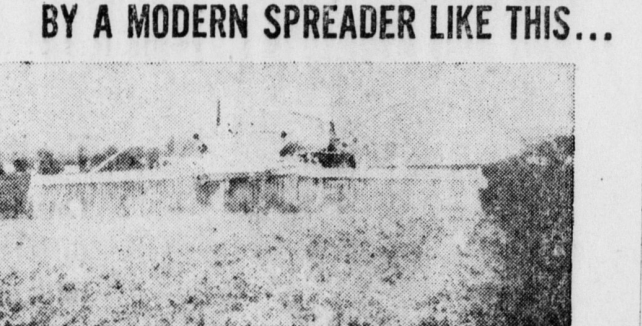
