faculty members, and has utilized every conceivable part of the present library building, which was originally designed to house only 12,000 books.

A picture library, record and reference collections, microfilm records and an L. V. C. memorabilia file have been included in the library's operation during Miss Myers' 35 years of service.

A resident of 120 College Ave., Anville, she has also been active over the years in the American Association of University Women, the Women's Society of World Service in the E. U. B. Church, and regional, state and national library associations.

She also helped in the founding of the Anville Free Library, taught English for a number of years at the college, and has been active as a lecturer and author.

That the college has appreciated her efforts and believes in the importance of well-equipped library facilities can be seen in the fact that construction of a new 100,000 book library is scheduled to begin within a few weeks on the campus.

Miss Myers leaves her position as the college librarian with a realm of memories concerning the life and the growth of the college as a whole as well as the library. "The making of a library," she says, "is more than just collecting books."

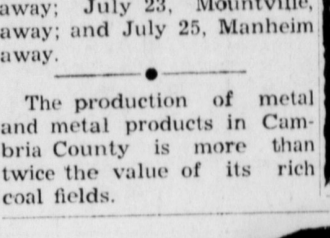
