Holstein Holds Unique Sale

Forty-seven head of purebred Holstein cattle carrying the bloodline of the great Lauxmont Rag Apple Lucinda sold for a total of \$30,335 Friday at the Keystone Holstein Auction on East Main Street. More than 500 dairymen from four-state area attended the unique sale to bid on the pedigreed animals.

Six of the bovine blue-bloods brought prices of \$1,000 or more while a seventh exceeded that mark with the help of her calf. Local cattle and local sales included a Lucifer daughter consigned by J. Lester Charles, Landisville. Charlaway Lucifer Promise, brought a bid of \$225 from Robert H. Kauffman, Manheim RI.

Before the start of the sale the president of the Lancaster County Holstein Breeders' Association presented a purebred calf to Dean Hoffer, Future Farmer of America at Manheim Central High School for winning the association's membership contest. Hoffer, who won an Ayrshire calf last fall at the Lampeter Fair, received a calf sired by Shaws S. A. F. Tiry, grand champion of the 1952 Lampeter Fair, out of a Lucifer daughter. The calf was bred on the farm of Henry M. Hess, Mt. Joy, RI.
