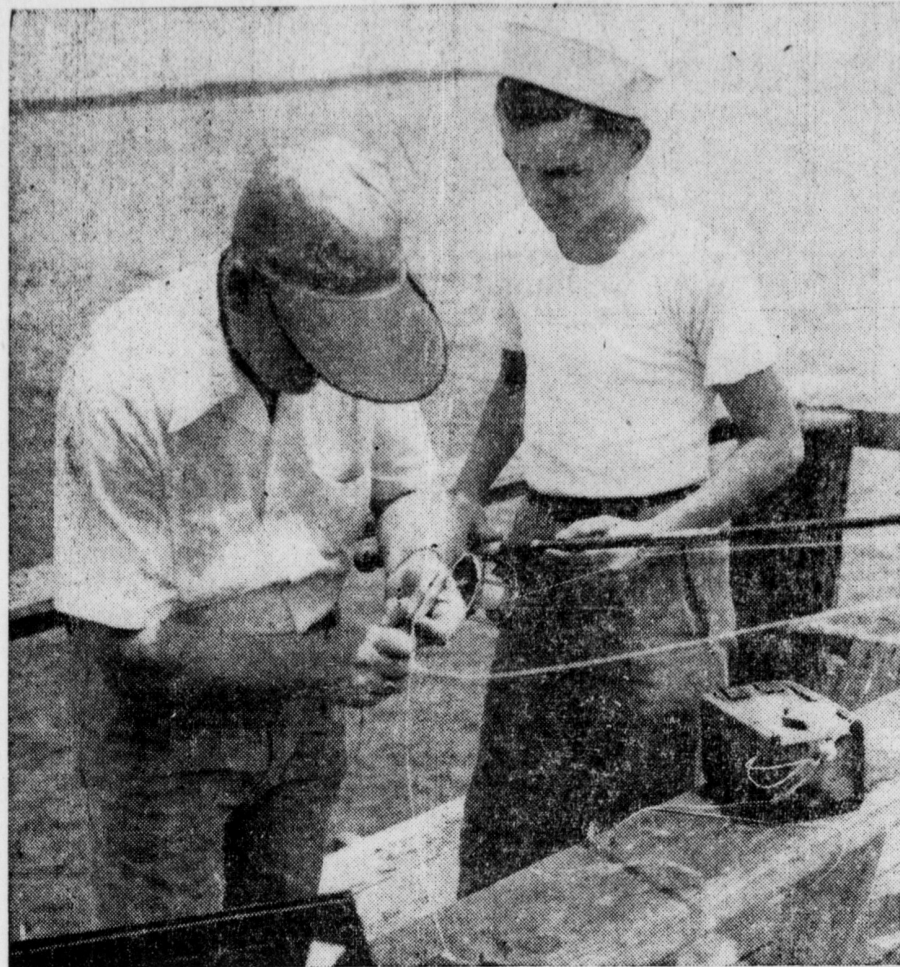
BAINBRIDGE
