**Group Approach
Proving Aid
To Weight Problem**

Harrisburg -PNS- The "group approach" to weight reduction is paying off these days for many Pennsylvanians, the State Department of Health said.

Note was taken of the fact that some people advised by their physician to lose weight find it difficult to do so alone, but the encouragement received from a group has made streamlining easier to many.

"Enthusiastic reports about the success of the group method of reducing are being received by the department continually," a spokesman said. "Our nutritionists are cooperating actively with local organizations interested in sponsoring group therapy classes."

Adult Education and Health Education Department Directors of both the YWCA and YMCA have been leaders in organization of such classes under medical and nutrition direction and guidance, the department said.

Similarly, nutritionists of the Health Department have helped the individuals in the groups to follow their physician's instructions by general and individual dietary checking and consultations. "Results have been gratifying to physicians, nutritionists and to the participating participants," the departmental experts concede.
