

Camp Meetings Open At Landisville Grounds

Landisville-Salunga — The Landisville Campmeeting Association of the Methodist Church opened their 86th annual session yesterday at the camp meeting grounds, Landisville. The annual event will continue through July 22. The Rev. Chester J. Buzzard, pastor of St. Paul's Methodist Church, Lancaster, is Spiritual Director for the camp meeting.
