PER CAPITA TAX The School District of the Township of East Donegal gives notice that its School Board intends to adopt a resolution on Friday, June 29, 1956, at 6:30 P. M. (standard time), 7:30 P. M. 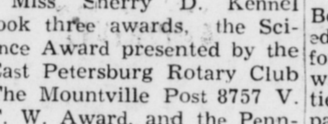
