Urges Voters Register

"The time has passed when a few men, locked away in a smoke-filled room, can make the great decisions in politics," William Dommel, Democratic Registration Chairman for the Mount Joy Area, declared today. "More and more Americans are taking part in the vital processes of our Democracy, because they realize that their right to vote under the constitution is a precious right, and if they neglect to use it, they may let their great heritage of freedom silently creep into the hands of those who may seek to destroy it," he added.

"For American voters, this will be a political year of great importance, Mr. Dommel went on to say. "Electing a President is always a vital event in our lives. But this year the vast, wide-reaching and persuasive machinery of campaign publicity and information will bombard the voter as never before.

The success or failure of many candidates may well depend on the amount of television time they can afford, and the skill with which they use it. Added to the potent force of the press, radio, magazines and public appearances, television insures that campaign coverage will be overwhelmingly complete.

"Thus, again as never before, puts you, the voter, in a special position of being wooed, sought after, beckoned to, and pleaded with, Mr. Dommel explained. "But to choose carefully and vote wisely, you must first be registered. This can be done easily enough at the Court House, where the Registrars are sitting from 8:30 a. m. until 5 p. m. each weekday, and from 8:30 a. m. until

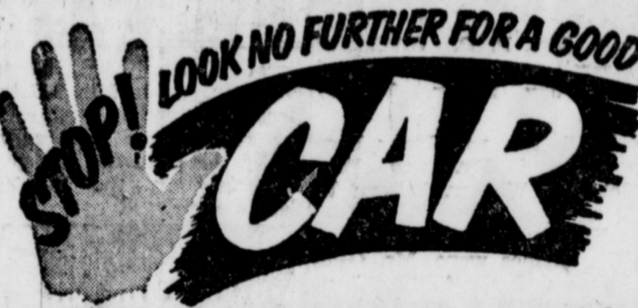
