Jehovah Witnesses To Meet At Reading

A delegation of 35 Jehovah's witnesses from the local congregation will travel to Reading to attend a four-day District Assembly sponsored by the Watchtower Society, August 2-5 at the Reading Fairgrounds, Harold E. McCorkel presiding minister of the group announced today.

"The purpose of the assembly," Mr. McCorkel said, "is to consider the progress and activity of Jehovah's witnesses throughout the district, to receive instruction on improving their ministry, and to keep abreast of the rapid expansion of their worldwide preaching work, which today is being done in over 160 lands by more than 650,000 ministers."

The district embraces territory which includes the following cities in Pennsylvania: Philadelphia, Harrisburg, Scranton, as well as Wilmington, Del. and Birmingham, N. Y.

The convention headquarters has received requests for rooming accommodations to date from witnesses from 11 states, the District of Columbia, and England; giving the convention an international flavor. It is expected that 5,500 or more delegates will attend making this the largest convention of its kind ever to be held in Reading.

Forty conventions in all, with identical programs, are being sponsored by the Watchtower Society in the United States, Canada, and the British Isles. The feature lecture of each convention will be, "Why Permanent Peace will come in our Day" to be delivered in Reading by Grand Superintendent, secretary-treasurer of the Watchtower Society, at 3 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 5.

Included among the 35 persons attending from the Columbia, Pa. Cong. will be H. K. Landis, owner of the Landis Stone Meal Co., Rheems.

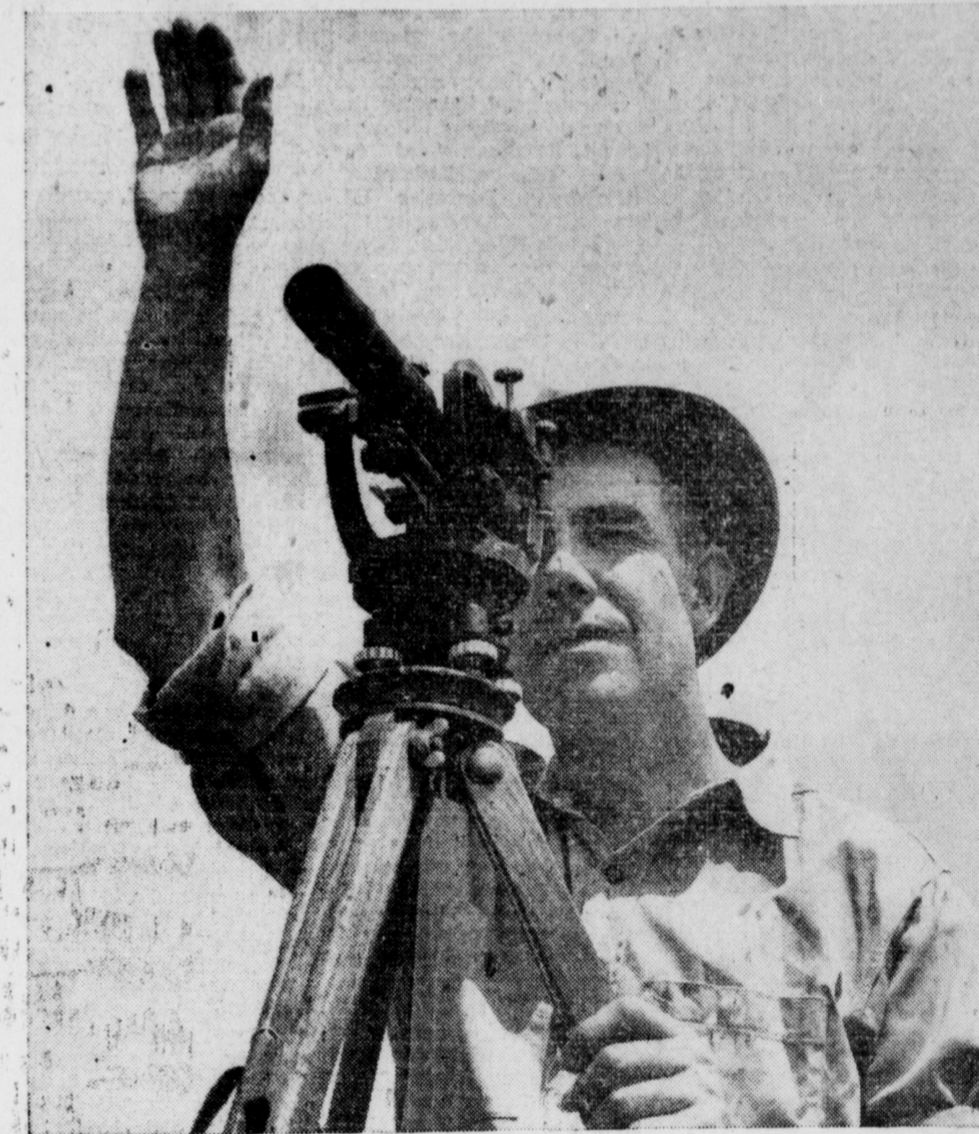
