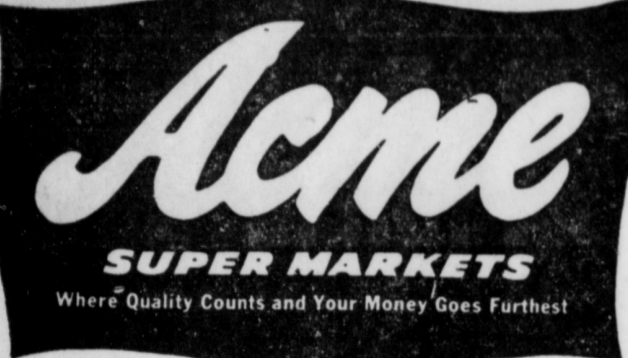

Danger Time For Youngsters

It's vacation time again for school children from country lanes to sprawling metropolitan areas.

And, it's danger time for these youngsters, too. Danger time, warns Edw. P. Curran, Safety Director of Keystone Automobile Club, because of the great numbers of boys and girls now free to play all day long every day and because of the soporific effect these warm, lazy days have upon many motorists.

"Men and women behind the wheels of the many thousands of cars using the streets and highways of this area daily must be doubly cautious and alert to prevent accidents, and especially mishaps involving children," he declared. "Children at play are un mindful of anything but the game itself; they dash across lawns and pavements and into the street or highway without thinking. Motorists must do the thinking for them."

"Parents and older children can help a lot, of course, by warning the youngsters of the increased danger now that school is over for several months and by keeping an eye on the players whenever possible.

"Essentially, however, motorists largely are responsible for the safety of children. They must be unusually careful and patient, drive slowly and strictly obey all traffic signals and posted warnings. Drivers absolutely cannot rely on a child keeping out of the path of automobiles; older heads must exercise the good judgment that should come with years of experience.

"Drivers extra careful this summer won't be deeply sorrowful later."

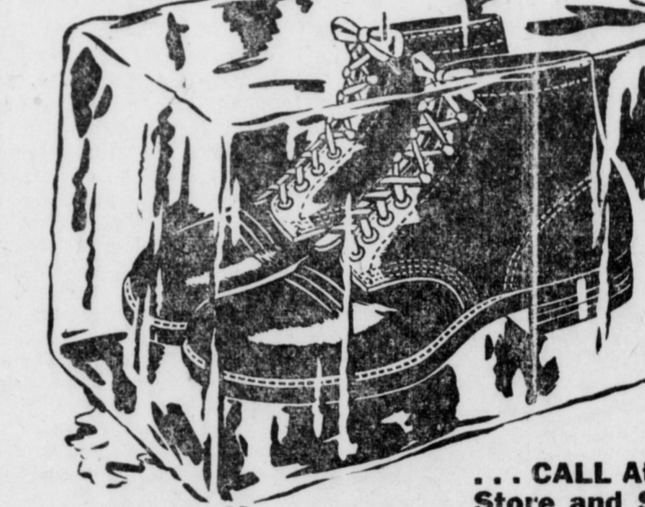
