OUT ON A LIMB

Remember when the only difficult thing about parking a car was getting the girl to agree to it? *

Nowadays parking is everybody's problem. Women, however, seem to find it the most difficult. Lucky Shields, down Oregon way, who sells those chain saws named after me, thinks that women drivers wouldn't have so much trouble squeezing into a parking place if they'd imagine it was a pair of shoes. *

There is a farmer in Maine who has solved the parking problem. He works at home making direct use of his tree crop. He has established a furniture making business right on his farm. He takes white pine, cuts it into lumber, then makes authentic reproductions of early American furniture from it. At the same time he carefully re-plants the trees he cuts so as to assure himself of a sturdy stand for many years to come. Seems as if more and more of our people are noticing how important tree farming really is. *

An optimist, I just learned, is a man who figures that when his shoes wear out he'll be back on his feet. *

Got telling a couple of new farmers how to fell a tree recently. I tell them the first step is to select the right trees for cutting. For the man who wants to keep his woods producing, I say, a forester can be of help. In many states, publicly employed foresters are available to teach any farmer how to select the trees he should cut. *

It's a good thing, I continue, and any local county agent can tell a man if this service is available in his community. If there ain't no such service, I'd recommend studying up in government bulletins from the Department of Agriculture, American Forest Products Industries, 1816 N Street, N.W., Washington, D.C., puts out some fine literature on this, and it's all for free. *

I never did get to tell these fellows how to cut a tree. Just as I got to the after you select the trees, they decide they need more information on tree selection and say they are going to take some courses in wood lot management. They're right. Anybody can cut a tree. Takes a good man to select one. *

The other day a friend of mine reminded me that parenthood is hereditary. "If your parents didn't have any children," he says, "chances are you'll never have any either." *

Down around Clark County, Alabama, there is a stand of 682,000 acres of forest which used to be cotton fields. Timber is now king: cotton is out. This has happened because several farmers down there began planting trees. The crop keeps coming, year after year. In this way there will always be enough lumber for houses and baseball bats and newspapers. Lumber in ample supply makes America the great nation it is today.

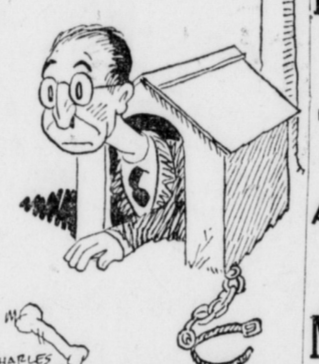
