Jehovah's Witnesses District Assembly

"Peace on earth does not rest with mankind," declared Grant Suiter, featured speaker of the Reading District assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses, before a delegation of 8311. Speaking on the subject "Why Permanent Peace Will Come in Our Day!" Suiter explained, "Peace on earth, a permanent one, is dependent upon the Almighty God of the Universe, Jehovah God."

"We know that permanent peace will come in our day because of the world situation that confronts us in fulfillment of the prophecy pronounced by Jesus at Luke 21: 25, 26. In Matthew's prophecy setting out the same matter, Chapter 24, Jesus said that these things are just the beginning or sorrows for this world. Following this, prior to the climax, he foretold the preaching of a message of hope. 'The good news of the kingdom will be preached in all the inhabited earth for the purpose of a witness to all the nations and then the end will come.'"

Saturday's program was highlighted by a baptism of 217 witnesses and the unanimous adoption of a resolution to be addressed to Nikolai Bulganin, Premier of the Soviet Russia, on behalf of fellow-witnesses who have been given sentences of up to 20 years imprisonment by Communist courts on charges of American espionage. Among the 217 baptized was Thelma Kraft from the local congregation.

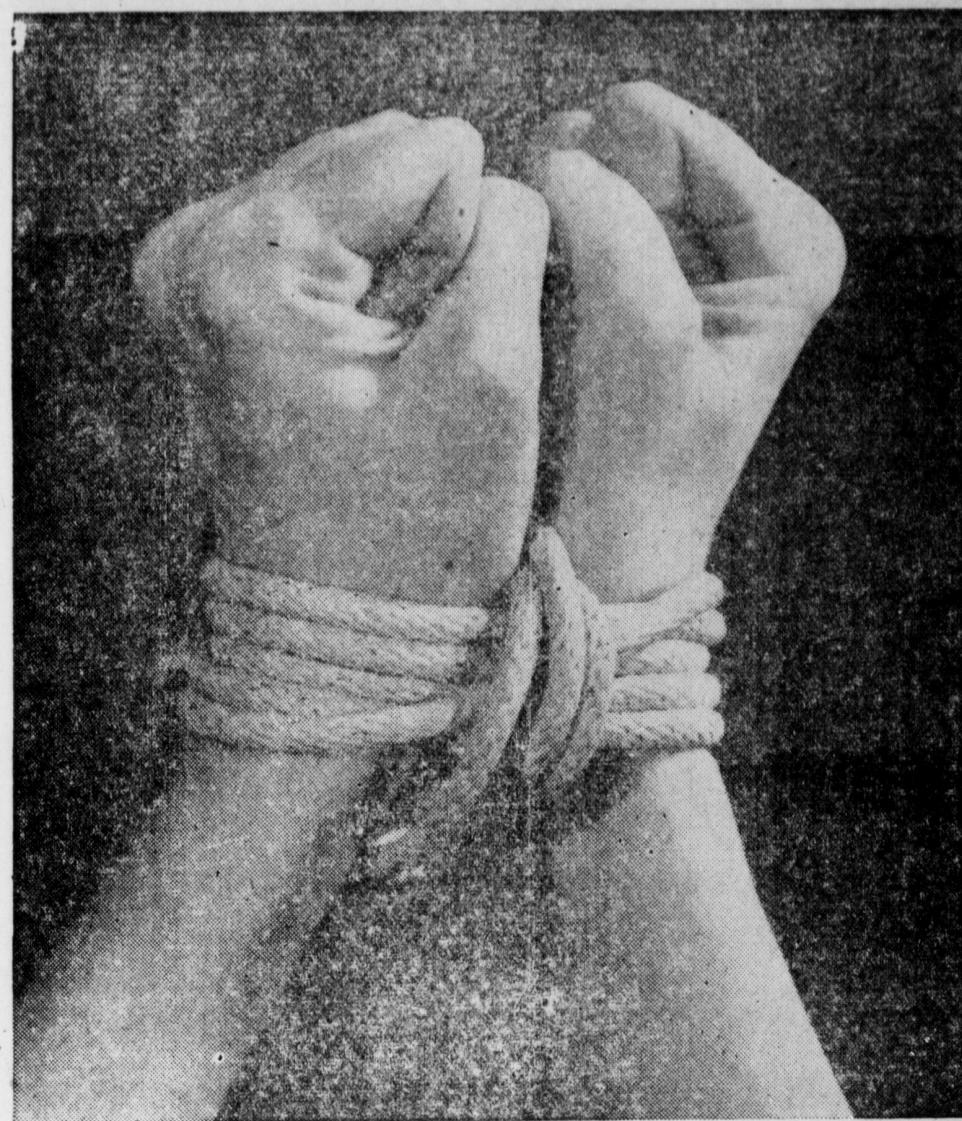
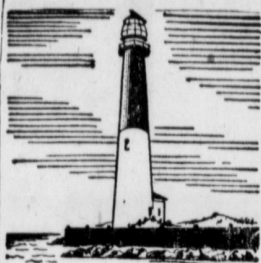
