As mentioned last week the Peck's church property was purchased in 1878 by Harmon L. Reich, and the name of Reich's Evangelical Church then originated.

In 1884 the Mount Joy Class was made a mission; and the Bethel, or Reich's Class inaugurated with it, continued to be served by the same minister for a number of years. At this time the Bethel, or Reich's Class consisted of the following members: Eli Z. Heisey and wife Annie, and son George R.; H. L. Reich (single); Mary Reich (widow); Sallie Reich, Samuel Grove, Eli Williams and wife Susan, and daughter Annie C., F. F. McCurdy, John Koller and wife Clara, Annie M. Hoover, Isaac K. Eshleman and wife, Lydia; Eshleman and wife, Lydia; Jonas Bertzfeld and wife, Annie H., John Ney, Catharine Idle (widow); Sarah Auch (married); Sallie Scelers (single); Benj. Shoaf, Caroline Naphaker, George Heartz and wife, Barbara. Records show that the address of the last eight names was Bainbridge, Pa. The Rev. D.W. Bicksler served as minister of the church from 1884 to 1885.

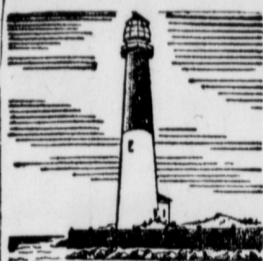
