NEW HOLSTEIN GREEN BOOK

A veritable green gold mine of vital Holstein statistics has been published by The Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

Volume 12 of the Type and Production Year Book - annual "green book" of Registered Holstein performance in official breed improvement programs - came off the press last week.

Stepped-up interest and participation in the national Holstein organization's extensive breed improvement work is reflected in the fact that Volume 12 contains 1,720 pages - up from 1,627 in Volume 11 issued last year.

The new volume - a valuable tool in the continuous selection of bloodlines, families and individual animals so vital to successful dairy cattle breeding - lists the official type classification and/or production records of daughters of 17,104 Holstein sires.

This basic "how did they milk and what did they look like?" information adds up to 66,000 production records, 25,000 Classification breakdowns and daughter-dam comparisons on 1,365 Holstein bulls.

Primary distribution of Volume 12 is to owners of registered Holstein herds on official production test. A limited number of additional copies are available at a nominal fee. - HFAA

REG. HOLSTEINS WEAR WELL

Longer lasting cows - increasingly important in the exacting economics of present day dairy farming - are spotlighted in a recent report of The Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

Dr. George R. Barrett, Superintendent of the Registry Department, has announced that 107 more registered Holsteins have qualified for recognition as outstanding lifetime producers.

Included in the group are 17 cows with career production totals of more than 150,000 lbs. of milk - roughly six times the lifetime output of the average dairy cow.

Ninety other registered Holsteins have hit the 100,000 lb. mark - in itself a coveted milestone of production persistence - on official test.

Dr. Barrett reported that the 107 newest Holstein longevity records were completed in 25 different states - from Maine to California and from Arkansas to North Carolina to Oregon and Montana.

All were made in Herd Improvement Registry - an official production testing program of The Holstein-Friesian Association of America working in close co-operation with the state agricultural colleges.

To date, 6,505 registered cows have completed official

lifetime records of 100,000 or more pounds of milk. Of these, 673 have crossed the 150,000 lb. line and 54 have compiled total production records of more than 200,000 lbs. of milk.

Noting that these truly remarkable accomplishments were without parallel in the entire history of dairy husbandry, Dr. Barrett pointed out that all three totals could be made even more impressive with the addition of the many registered Holsteins which have completed similar records in DHIA and other unofficial testing programs.

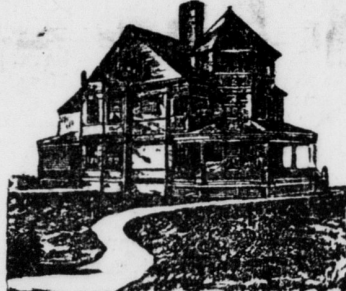
