The smart shopper with space in her home freezer will find beef cuts a buy, according to Elsie Barnesberger, extension consumer education specialist of the Pennsylvania State University.

There's a seasonal lag in demand because of heat-jaded appetites. Blade chuck or rib roasts in many markets become consumers to buy them for freezer storage.

Another reason for buying beef - U. S. Choice grade beef is in unusually good supply now.

SOLVENT CLEANER EASES PAINTING

Take the easy way to prepare furniture for painting. If the surface is smooth, use a solvent cleaner to cut the glossy surface and make "tooth" for the next coat.

Doris L. Snook, extension home management specialist of the Pennsylvania State University, points out that the use of a solvent cleaner eliminates the need for using abrasive paper, steel wool, or undercoat.

Solvent cleaner dries instantly and paint may be applied at once. A number of brands of cleaner are available.

NEWSPAPER ADVERTISING PAYS

Who is that intrepid soul who designed to say that newspaper advertising doesn't pay? Well, let him read the following:

In the April 26, 1956 issue of the West Branch (Iowa) Times, there appeared a two column, 2 1/2 inch ad which read: "WANTED - GENERAL SOAKING RAIN. PLEASE RUSH - CLIFF PERKINS." The ad cost Cliff Perkins \$2.45.

The West Branch Times April 26 issue came out on that morning. By supper time that evening, it was raining, and it rained off and on for the next two weeks, breaking a dry spell that had lasted for seven or eight months.

Duane C. Griggs, Editor and Publisher of the Times, who proudly proclaims that West Branch is the birthplace of former President Herbert Hoover, made this brief, but apt comment: "Oh, the power of newspaper advertising!"

Now don't let any skeptic try to tell you that this was purely coincidental.
