According to Thomas, this results in the failure of the station to take on the scene pictures of the Fire Police and fire fighters at work at these incidents for televising.

He pointed out that the public is more interested in seeing the actual pictures on their television of the buildings burning and the firemen fighting the fires than a picture after the fire is out.

Both Fire Police and firemen were asked to cooperate with the station by calling WGAL TV Station, COLLECT, as soon as the alarm is given.

NATIONAL LETTER WRITING WEEK

National Letter Writing Week will again be celebrated in Mount Joy during the week October 7 to 13. Postmaster Zerphey announced today.

Commenting on the significance of National Letter Writing Week, Mr. Zerphey pointed out that each year since 1938 this event has been observed as a reminder of the real meaning of a personal letter.

Emphasizing the traditional sanctity of the letter mail, Mr. Zerphey reminded Mt. Joy residents that one of the basic American Freedoms is the uncensored transmission of their first class mail. It is the most valuable possession of the citizens of a free country.

"We all know the human importance of letter writing," Mr. Zerphey stated, "the way in which it holds scattered families together, of giving comfort and love to the people of the land. But its value is immeasurably greater than that. Its implications are almost infinite.

"We in America have the privilege of uncensored and unlimited means of communication. With this in mind, I urge all citizens of Mount Joy to join me in this national celebration. Let's make National Letter Writing Week for 1956 the greatest ever."

Work went on as usual for the Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children during the summer months. Fourteen (14) diagnostic clinics were held with an attendance of 223; 22 of whom were new patients. There were 72 patients seen. Knowing the importance of a good educational background for handicapped children, operations, whenever possible, are done at the close of the school year. The orthopedic surgeons took time from their busy days to allow for special clinic and extra operations. Eight (8) children were operated on in June.

The orthopedic nurse, occupational and physical therapists made 1253 visits for exercises, functional activities and careful watching that shoes and braces are kept in good repair and fit properly. Parallel bars, walkers, canes and crutches of all types were taken to homes in helping children and adults get back to, as normal as possible, type of living.

Nor did our volunteers take a vacation. 450 hours of service was given by Board Members, Easter Seal workers, Junior League, Shriners and friends of crippled children.

The Craft Classes met regularly in the Treatment Center, 129 East Orange Street, Lancaster, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of each week. Members of the Class with the guidance of the occupational therapist, Miss Reba Sebelist, planned a picnic and invited the Staff of the Society to join them. The organization and preparation was done by the Class and the transportation provided by the Staff.

The Pre-school Cerebral Palsy Center, a co-operative program of the Lancaster County Society for Crippled Children & Adults, Lancaster Township and County School District will be moved to a kindergarten room in the James Buchanan School, S. West End Avenue. The Center will open September 10 with sessions held Monday through Friday, 1:00 to 3:15 p. m. Dr. S. June Smith spent several days in the Society office, 129 East Orange St., Lancaster evaluating the handicapped children who were recommended to the Center.

Seven children were at Camp Easter Seal, near Somerset, Pa., three at Harmony Hall at Highspire, two adults at Camp Daddy Allen near White Haven and three families attended the Family Institute at Camp Easter Seal.
