## Holstein Tested By Association

A special report of The Holstein-Friesian Association of America, Brattleboro, Vt., announces the completion of an official production record by a registered Holstein cow in the herd of M. M. Wenger, Rheems.

Walker Bonheur Homestead 3234230, was milked twice daily for 301 days and produced a total of 13,323 lbs. of milk plus 531 pounds of butterfat. The cow is a five-year-old.

The Pennsylvania State University supervised the weighing and testing of this record which compares with an annual production of only 5815 pounds of milk and 224 pounds of butterfat by the average U. S. cow. The new record is a part of the national Holstein organization's Herd Improvement Registry—a popular official testing program designed to provide individual lactation and lifetime production records on every cow in participating herds.

Registered Holstein breeders in all 48 states are utilizing HIR records as tools in the wise selection of individuals, families and bloodlines so vital to the continued improvement of their herds.

## 4-H BABY BEEF ENROLLMENT PERIOD

The time for farm boys and girls to enroll in the 4-H Baby Beef Project is at hand; youth 10 to 20 years of age are eligible. The deadline for signing up in this feeding project has been set as Saturday, Oct. 6.

The 4-H Baby Beef project that each club member feed on a steer calf of one of the major beef breeds. This steer is purchased in November when weighing around 400 pounds in weight; the animal is fed about one year and placed on the market at the time of a district or county show and sale.

Instruction is given during the year by the County Agricultural Agent with the assistance of local Club Leaders; assistance in rations, feeding, management, fitting, and in showmanship is extended to each of the families. The 4-H Club has regular monthly meetings for the purpose of training in parliamentary procedure and in learning to speak before a group and in working together.

The Red Rose 4-H Baby Beef Club is the county-wide organization for the baby beef project. This club had a membership in excess of 100 members for a number of years. The steers are placed on feed for local Community Farm Shows, the District

Show at Lancaster. The Eastern National Show at Timonium, Maryland and the Pennsylvania State Farm Show at Harrisburg.

Interested boys and girls may enroll by giving their name and address to any present member of the Red Rose Club by not later than October 3, or by contacting one of the following adult Club Leaders: Ira L. Rutt, of Peach Bottom; Fred W. Linton, Quarryville R2; Mylin R. Good, Lancaster R3; Jay R. Nissley, Manheim R4; Harry S. Showalter, Reinholds R1; or Victor M. Longenecker, E-town R3. Enrollments will also be accepted at the Extension Service Office, 202 Post Office Bldg., Lancaster.

It is important that farm youth enroll by the above deadline in order to permit time for the Club Leaders to secure the desired number of steer calves.
