Special excursion rates are offered by the Pennsylvania railroad for a visit to historic Philadelphia Saturday, Oct. 13. The special bargain rate is \$3.20 round trip for adults and \$1.65 for children and teenagers between the ages of 5 and 18. A special sightseeing tour for \$2.10 extra will include a two-hour drive to points of interest such as Independence Hall, Congress Hall, historical shrines and a three-hour visit to the zoo. The train will leave Mount Joy at 8:45 and arrive in Philadelphia at 10:15 a.m. The return trip will be from 5:15 leaving Philadelphia and arriving in Mt.
