Steer Feeders Tour Oct. 16

An all-day tour for Lancaster County steer feeders is being planned for Tuesday, Oct. 16, by the Agricultural Extension Service. This educational trip is open to the general public and steer feeders are urged to attend. Educational stops on this

tour will include the Medford Packing Co., Chester, Pa., where the group will observe a progressive slaughter plant, the making of meat by-products, and the inspection of the various grades of cattle and hogs both on foot and dressed carcasses. A better understanding of the desired market grades of livestock at this time is important to more efficient production.

The second stop of the tour will be a trip through the assembly plant of the Ford Motor Company at Chester; here the group will have a chance to see an assembly line in action and the end product — a new 1957 Ford. After the above two stops the group will move to West Grove to the livestock farm of the Medford Company to enjoy picnic lunch (bring your own) and study the feeding operations of cattle on these farms.

Those interested in this tour are urged to report by Saturday, October 13th, to M. M. Smith, County Agricultural Agent, 202 P. O. Bldg., Lancaster, telling of their desire to travel by bus or by car.

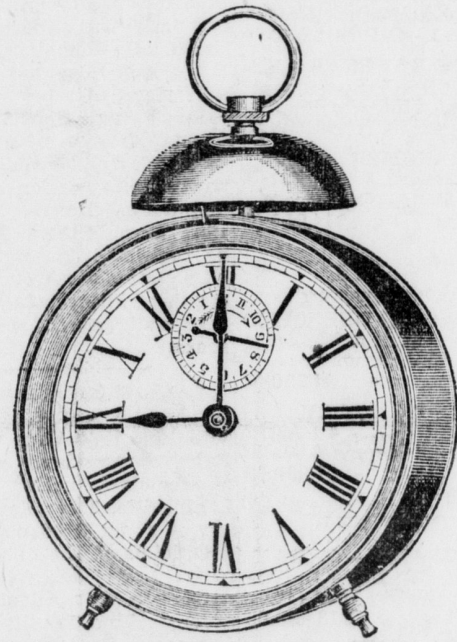
