Church Plans Ground Breaking

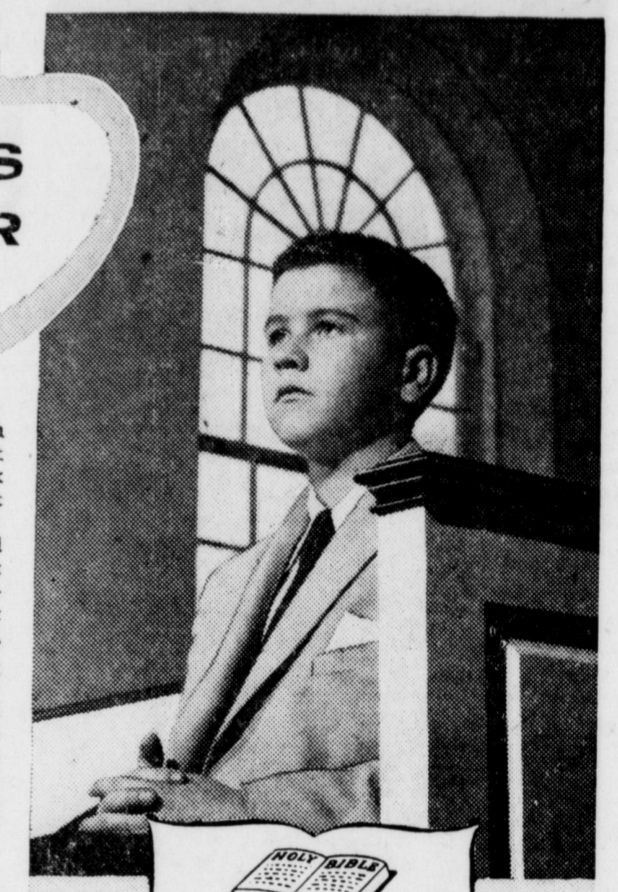
