Board To Attend Meetings

School board members of the Donegal Joint School system made plans to attend special council and convention meetings at their regular Thursday night meeting. Members will attend the F. & M. branch of the Philadelphia Area Study Council and Lancaster County Principals' Association convention November 8 at the Lancaster Twp. Junior High School, Dr. Deemer of Great Neck, Long Island, will be the guest speaker. The members will also attend the annual school board institute of Temple University. The three meetings will be December 6, February 14 and April 25.

The board passed a motion providing money for petty cash funds for the elementary schools in the district not to exceed \$25 per month for each school. A plan to eliminate an overcrowded class at the Marietta Elementary school was approved pending the approval of the parents. This plan provides for the transfer of first grade pupils from Marietta where one teacher has 41 pupils to Maytown, where 49 pupils are taught by two teachers. Already six parents have approved of the plan. A total of 8 to 10 will be transferred.

Schools of the district will be closed today and tomorrow for the annual county institute being held at the Manheim Township High School.

Wilbur Beshm, supervising principal, reported an attendance for September of 98%. The total enrollment for the district was reported to be 2298 students. The purchase of football insurance coverage from Harry Zook, Marietta, was approved by the board after 8 p.m. Closed all day Wednesday.

Martin Shenk, a faculty member was named as dramatic coach and will first direct the senior play next month. Dr. Russel P. Stoner, Marietta, was recommended by the board to the state department of health as the Marietta Elementary School physician and Dr. Richard C. Howell, Marietta, as assistant dentist for the high school dental clinic.

The board announced that extension education classes offering typing, driver education, sewing, woodshop and art are now in session. Visiting day for teachers in the district to visit other schools was approved by the board but no date was set. The board also approved a motion that Lloyd Sicad, who attended East Donegal High School be granted a Donegal High School diploma for education courses just completed in the Army.

Professional employee contracts were granted to three former district principals who were left without district principal duties by the recent consolidation. Eugene Saylor, building principal of the Maytown Elementary building; John Buch, building principal of the Marietta building and Charles Heaps, building principal of the Mt. Joy building. All three will teach fifty percent or more of the time, the board announced.
